Minister's Message - September 2025

'September, Harvest and Beyond' by Revd Phil Rodd

As usual, I'm writing this letter trying to imagine September, and the new term, and everything it might contain, at a time when I haven't actually yet been away for a summer holiday. In many ways, though, it's been good to stay put, to see the sunshine, to enjoy the local countryside, and to attend as many of the village fêtes as possible! Some of our local churchyards have hosted Wild Church services, which have given us the opportunity to stop, look and listen - and to see what God is saying to us through our natural surroundings. Many churchyards now have areas that have been 'wilded' - and I've been struck by the enormous increase in insect life (in pollinators, in other words) that has resulted from this.

I'm greatly looking forward to the new school year, and to seeing (and hearing) the children excitedly returning to Fleggburgh Primary School just over the road where I live - and the opportunity to join in their regular school assemblies. Here as elsewhere in the Flegg Parishes, we also have 'Open the Book' teams involved in taking dramatic presentations of Bible stories into many local primary schools. Our pupil audiences are amazingly enthusiastic - and very forgiving when things don't go quite right! Over the summer many of our team members have had some training to improve our skills. So - we're raring to go!

September also starts the round of church harvest services. (See the list in the column opposite.) It's a time to marvel at the miracle of the tiny insignificant seed that gets buried in the soil, forgotten by most of us, but which - through the dedicated work of our farmers - then grows and multiplies, in all its myriad forms and varieties, producing enough food to feed all 8 billion of us (as well as the animals!) As the old harvest hymn puts it: 'We thank thee, then, O Father, For all things bright and good; The seedtime and the harvest, Our life, our health, our food.' Truly these are all God's good gifts to us - gifts to be received thankfully, and gifts to be shared generously.
