

### HOPE

'I see nothing but uncertainty, contention, conflict, beliefs unsettled and nothing established in place of them'.

These words were written by the British artist George Frederick Watts back in 1885 following personal tragedy and at a time of economic decline and environmental damage caused by the industrial revolution. They could have been written by someone today, 140 years later.

Shortly after writing those words,
George Frederick Watts painted 'Hope'.
It depicts Hope as a blindfolded, worldweary woman, sitting on the world,
plucking a broken harp with one string
remaining, and a single, distant star in
the sky. Does the painting depict the
loss of hope, or the boldness of hope
which helps us to carry on, when all
around us seems bleak and despairing?

I sense that there is today a lack of hope among many people. Life has become more challenging for a lot of people over the last few years. Some even say that fear of the future is one reason behind a declining birth rate in the UK. Conflicts around the world threaten global security. If I am honest, there are times when I find myself struggling to be 'hope-full', as my reservoir of hope is depleted.

# SALTES

I don't have any easy answers so I'm going to grapple with it some more. My starting point is that we can't escape the things that can make us despair, but to counter them we must ground our hope in something (or someone) more solid and certain.

The author of Psalm 42 in the Bible asked himself why he felt unsettled in his soul and low in spirit. Then he reminded himself 'Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my help and my God'.



So, this is where I'll begin, as I seek to have my hope renewed. I reckon it's not a not a bad place to start. What do you think?
