Rev Alison's letter for October

Dear Friends,

Autumn is well upon us now. The landscape has changed its colours. The leaves have fallen from the trees. Our thoughts turn to Harvest. Harvest memories will vary for each one of us, according to our geography and background. Harvest growing up in East Manchester was probably much different to Harvest here, in Darwen!

Throughout the years, our understanding of Harvest has changed. Yet, Harvest was, and still is, a time of hard work. It involves bringing in the crops that have been carefully tended throughout the summer. And then celebrating this with a church service. For those who still live in rural areas, or work in agriculture, and to an extent those who grow produce in their gardens or on an allotment, Harvest will continue to mean much the same. Growing produce is not easy. There are many challenges; the right weather, good soil, and careful timing are all needed to yield a successful crop.

We plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the land, But it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand. He sends the snow in winter, the warmth to swell the grain, The breezes and the sunshine, and soft refreshing rain.

A bountiful harvest is a true cause for celebrating and thanksgiving. For both the work of the farmers and the providence of God.

For those of us who may be less connected to how our food is grown and produced, harvest will be experienced differently. Food is generally bought from a shop, with little knowledge of those energies needed to produce it. And with the ability to ship produce across the world, we are not always aware of

what foods are in season, and whether or not the weather has been kind this year.

But, no matter where we might be, Harvest festivals are a time for us all to consciously take time to pause and give thanks for the food. Food which we share and those who have worked to produce it. In recent years, the emphasis at Harvest has turned to bringing non-perishable packets and tinned food. And then the food is distributed to those in need. Which with the cost of living constantly rising now, this is more important than ever. Our foods donated at St Peter's will be donated to the Food Larder.

Yet the principle remains the same, to give thanks, to all who have produced it and to God.

We thank You, our Creator, for all things bright and good: The seedtime and the harvest, our life, our health, our food.

Accept the gifts we offer for all Your love imparts; Accept what You most welcome: our humble, thankful hearts!

The Harvest festival in church, may seem quite late - it is **Sunday 26**th **October.** It follows on from Harvest festivals, in church, for both Holy Trinity and St Peter's school. It will also be a family service, so more accessible for our younger people to join in with us.

So, let us sing ...

All good gifts around us are sent from heav'n above. Then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord for all His love.

Please do your best to join us and give thanks for the harvest this year.


