



Red Letter Days October 2025

n the 18th we celebrate Luke the Evangelist. The readings for that day are: Acts 16 1-12, 2 Timothy 4v 5-17, Luke 10 v1-9. In Acts we read how Paul had Timothy circumcised so that he would be accepted by the Jews, which means he must have been a Gentile. In Timothy, Paul is instructing him how to proclaim 'the message'. Paul writes 'you yourself must keep calm and sane at all times' (which I think is so essential. I always say when I cut myself 'It will clot so keep calm'). In Luke Jesus is sending out 72 in pairs to every town 'carry no purse or pack and go barefoot'.

The 28th is the Apostles Simon and Jude. Simon (1st Century) Apostle - western tradition says that he first preached in Egypt and then joined Jude (who had been in Mesopotamia) and they went together to Persia where they suffered martyrdom (Oxford dictionary of Saints).

On Sunday the Homily told us about looking for things. My trouble is I put it in a safe place and then forget where the safe place is. Failing eye sight does not help. Many is the time that I take a broom and go through the house thinking of the woman in the Bible who lost a 'mite'. The first thing to do is ask St Anthony, then tidy everything that needs doing and it will turn up. That book you are looking for cannot melt.

What a joy it was to hear Sue Dickensons' voice on Wednesday Zoom Morning Prayer. Evidently Lesley's Mother is in an adjacent ward with a broken leg so they are getting plenty of visits. Jane Maclure is home with her broken hip so I hope three accidents will be all we have in our benefice. My mother always said that everything comes in threes. If you break a cup you will end up breaking 2 more.

The wind is blowing the leaves off some of my trees but the Japanese wind flowers are just dancing in the breeze, there was a rose bud by my steps. At Poundstock we were welcomed with two beautiful vases of Flowers in the Porch. Even if the weather seems horrible there is still beauty to be found.

Whenever I am feeling useless I remember my relative who was blind. When asked what he did all day he replied 'I count my blessings'. We all have so much to be thankful



Tips from Poll's Garden for October

I hope you've been able to enjoy the fruits of your labours with visual and edible produce from your gardens?

October usually sees the first frost blackening the foliage of tender plants, such as dahlias. The autumn

leaves also begin to colour up and eventually fall. It's time to dismantle the summer displays and prepare the garden for the winter ahead.

Its a great time to get ahead and make early sowings of hardy annual flowers and bedding plants, along with vegetable crops like onions, garlic, broad beans and peas. Planting now will make use of bare soil, which can help to prevent soil erosion and hold nutrients into the earth, while also giving you earlier crops of vegetables and flowers.

Rake up fallen leaves from lawns, borders, driveways and paths, and store in a leaf mould bin to rot down into leaf mould.

Build a log pile at the back of a border for wildlife to shelter in.

Check that your shed is secure and waterproof, so you can safely store tools and patio furniture in it over winter.

Apply an autumn lawn feed to revive the grass after the rigours of summer.

Give your pond some autumn maintenance, including removing barley straw, placed in the pond in spring to discourage algae, once it has turned black.

Empty ceramic and glazed pots that aren't frost proof and store in a shed over winter.

Spike compacted lawns and brush grit into the holes to improve drainage.

Fork up perennial weeds, including horsetail or bindweed, removing every bit of root.

Cut autumn-fruiting raspberries down to the ground after harvesting.

Collect up hoses and drip-feed systems and store indoors over winter, so they don't freeze and split.


Clean out and disinfect bird boxes.

Gather up canes and plant supports that are no longer in use, and store indoors over winter.

Go on regular snail hunts, especially on damp evenings, to reduce overwintering populations.

Then as the days get shorter, relax and reflect on the year ahead.
