I hope you've had a lovely break during the summer, relaxing by a pool or the sea, reading a blockbuster or just chatting and playing with family and friends. Chances are your information intake has been much reduced. Yet now, back at the computer, the tsunami returns; emails, attachments, zoom calls and meetings, online newsletters and crucial videos of favourite sporting moments or dogs riding skateboards (or is that just me?).

There is much research into information overload. 500 years ago, a typical worker would have been exposed to about one book's worth of knowledge in a lifetime. 100 years ago, it would have been a small library. Today, we are hit with the equivalent of a large library **every year**, yet our brain processing speed has in no way kept up with this onslaught. We therefore learn to scan, to filter and, in so doing, become distracted in our thinking and superficial in our analysis. Unfettered, it can lead us to becoming mentally overwhelmed and even unwell.

As ever, the bible has the answer.

In Psalm 37 it says, 'Be still, and know that I am God'.

Time spent being still has huge benefits for creativity. 'Deep silence is the mother of creativity' said Ravi Shankar, Sitar virtuoso. Mozart said, 'In the silence, the music comes to me'.

Time spent being still has huge benefits for mental health. It can lower blood pressure, improve concentration and focus, calm racing thoughts, stimulate brain growth, reduce cortisol and help prevent insomnia.

By far the most important benefit of being still comes from sitting in the presence of Jesus. Mother Theresa observed, 'in the silence of the heart, God speaks.'

'Be still and know that I am God.'

The ultimate benefit from being still is not creativity or mental health but a knowledge of and intimacy with the God who made us and loves us. Just two minutes a day is enough to start the practice, and the benefits are out of this world.
