

#### Vicar's Letter

Autumn is well and truly underway and harvest celebrations abound. Church festivals, community suppers and lunches - what's not to love! In Archenfield Benefice we try to encourage creativity in our harvest services: poetry, prose, skits, music, artwork, displays of flowers and produce. I'm really looking forward to it all.

October also brings us National Poetry Day on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup>. I love how poems can make me laugh, cry and wonder. They can comfort, protest, satirise, challenge and shock; be powerfully held within a prescribed form or dance to their very own tune. And it can be so much fun it can be to have a go yourself.

I was recently reminded of a lovely poem by local poet David Donaldson called 'Hentland', which tells the remarkable history of that beautiful church and the saint whose name it takes.

All legend now. And resonance of old names Grown apart. As the land of the hedgehogs Lies curled up in the name of Archenfield.

So, as growth rings within ever-widening Circles, the vanished settlement south Of the Old Church, itself the Gospel

Taken root here centuries before
The ministries of Rome. Long past also,
Dubricius, Hentland's Patron saint,

His pregnant mother thrown into the Wye, Only to survive and still deliver the child Destined to heal the leper-king, her Dishonoured father and long buried The favoured irchen at Dubricius' feet, And his monastery of the brethren nearby.

Stories, like leaves bedded down: rich Nourishment to connect with what remains: The lip well, still flowing, threading its way

Through shade beside this later church And subsiding graves, part a managed Wilderness. Is it favoured of hedgehogs?

And beyond the churchyard wall Meadow grasses where the settlement Once stood and the air whispering

In ancient trees.

If you want to hear more of David's poetry, you'll have to come along to our Orcop Harvest Festival, and if you you've never seen the church that inspired this verse, do pay Hentland a visit.

My own attempt at a verse about Dubricius was rather less convincing:

There once was a man called Dubricius whose mother was treated most vicious.

He rose to the top of the clerical crop and was sainted, this man so propitious.

Why not have a dabble yourself?



#### **Green Garway Book Group**

#### Wavewalker by Suzanne Heywood

This is a real high seas girls own adventure story that we enjoyed discussing at book club last night.

When Suzanne was six her parents decided to circumnavigate the world on their boat Wavewalker to commemorate Captain Cook's voyage 200 years previously. With sponsorship from the hotel group Trusthouse Forte, they set sail in 1976 and intended to be at sea for three years.

A decade later, Suzanne finally broke free and embarked on her own life journey studying zoology at Oxford instead of following the dreams of her parents.

In writing this book she reveals the truth behind this big adventure and from her perspective it wasn't the thrill and wonder that we may imagine at all. She was treated differently from her brother, and as a girl expected to be cleaning and cooking below deck. Her parents were neglectful, almost abusive, leaving her brother ashore with a family for five days as he wasn't ready in time when they set sail. They expected her, aged 12, to be able to handle a revolver when some robbers tried to come aboard, advising her to shoot for the kneecaps. Added to the PTSD she suffered as the result of a terrible storm, it is no wonder she resorted to calling Childline in desperation.

Reading a memoir about trauma so soon after the revelations about *The Salt Path* made us all a bit more cynical about how much truth there is. It led us to check what the rest of the family had to say about Suzanne's version of events, which you can read in MailOnLine. Suffice to say there are many versions of truth depending on whose perspective you are reading.

# TUESDAY OCTOBER 14th 7.30pm GARWAY HALL £5.00 A REAL PAIN

Sharp, funny and emotional, *A REAL PAIN* somehow manages to combine sharp one-liners with real depth of feeling. The film follows ill-matched cousins David and Benjii on a week-long tour of Poland which they are visiting in memory of their Holocaust survivor grandmother.

David is an uptight, overly stressed advertising salesman from Brooklyn - Benjii a drop-out without partner, job or home who nevertheless deeply loved his grandmother. He is genuinely seeking to connect with her past and honour her memory. He's completely uninhibited about saying what he thinks or blurting out the inappropriate comment to the aghast tour group and tour leader.

Funny and alarming at the same time, Kieran Culkin, (who was Roman Roy in *Succession*), is magnificent as Benjii. Jesse Eisenberg as David trails behind his outrageous cousin, both loving and hating him at the same time. The balance of humour and trenchant emotion is something of a triumph for Jesse Eisenberg who also wrote and directed the film. With a soundtrack of Chopin, played by the Canadian-Israeli pianist Tzvi Erez, *A* 

*REAL PAIN* somehow manages to tackle the question of how current generations confront the reality of the Holocaust with a deft light touch that shows intelligence, humour and compassion and is never trite.

As ever, there'll be a chance to catch up with friends and enjoy teas, coffees, wines and award-winning local juices before the film and during the interval.

#### Book Review Frank and Red by Matt Coyne

Frank is a grumpy old man. Red is an endearing and intelligent six-year-old boy who moves in next door and whose irritating presence becomes apparent to Frank as he sits in his garden.

"It was the most annoying sound he had ever heard. It sounded like a squeaky toy being dry-humped by a donkey. Apparently, the new kid next door owned a trampoline."

Red and his mother have moved in reluctantly following his father's exit from their home to replace his wife with a younger model. So she is sad. And Red too is sad – a new home that he did not want, a lost

friend who meant a lot to him, a sad mother and, worse still, a new school where he becomes the butt of bullies.

Following advice from Frank about how to stand up to bullies, Red finds himself invited to remove himself from school for a week and, in the absence of anyone else to look after him while his mother is at work, Frank becomes reluctant carer to this strange but appealing child.

Frank has had almost no contact with the outside world since the death of his wife Marcie and his estrangement from his son – to the point where agoraphobia has set in.

But Red is on a mission now – a mission to restore the relationship between Frank and his son, and one that he pursues with the naivety of youth – the certainty that a solution can be found to anything if you just stick with it.

This is a sad, but uplifting book. It manages to skim the shores of mawkishness by its humour – it is simply hilarious in places. It's a good read – in fact a better read than the well-known *A Man Called Ove* by Swedish author Fredrik Backman which pursues a similar theme but is darker and harbours pretensions of literary greatness. I preferred Coyne's lighter touch which nevertheless reached the heart of the shared sadness of these two unlikely friends.

#### **Another letter from America**

Very nearly a whole year has gone by living here in Boston and it has flown. I think I can safely say we're feeling settled now. Six months ago I was thinking that living in Boston is definitely different but not really 'foreign' and the longer we're here the less foreign it feels.

We swapped England for New England, geographically the closest bit of America to Herefordshire - 3,170 miles in fact – but it's not just the relatively small distance which makes us feel not so far away, it's that Old England is still very present here. The place names in Massachusetts (officially The Commonwealth of Massachusetts) for example; at the weekend we went to a pretty seaside place called Manchester, near Gloucester, in the county of Essex. There's a Tewkesbury in Middlesex county, there's Worcester close to Shrewsbury. There's even a Ludlow and Leominster (said Leminster) and many, many more. I live in Roslindale (named after Roslin in Scotland) which is in the county of Suffolk.

Now I was born in Suffolk, UK and spent most of my school holidays near Bury St Edmunds and a lot of my family still live there. The Suffolk accent is very distinct and elements of that accent remain strongly in the local Boston accent. We all know Americans use a hard R sound e.g. 'caR'. In Boston it is said 'caH', no strong R. Other often quoted examples of the accent would be 'birds of a feathah flock togetha' and 'pahk yuh cah in hahvuhd yahd' (park your car in Harvard Yard). It's still very much an American accent of course (think Mark Wahlberg, Matt Damon, Ben Afflick) but when I catch the local accent with a hint of East Anglia, it makes me smile.

We haven't really been that far afield on holiday yet. We're busy making plans to see the Fall foliage in Vermont but for our first break we chose to come back to the UK for a couple of weeks. It was a complete joy to be with our friends and family and to eat again favourites such as custard creams, pork pie, toast and marmalade etc. I thought I'd jump in the car and immediately feel at home driving on the left but no, I didn't, oh well. It was hot and sunny for the fortnight we were back, so we were glad we weren't missing out on any Boston sunshine (but we did miss our central air conditioning).

It was very painful waving goodbye to everyone for a second time, but we had to get on that plane. I didn't give it much thought as to how we'd feel when we landed (besides tired) and as the taxi drove us back along familiar streets, I realised there was a definite feeling of 'phew, we're home, I'm happy to be here'.

#### **Garden Notes**

Every year I have planted up a galvanised tin bath which originally came from my grandparent's farm: bulbs for spring followed by annuals for the summer. It is plonked on top of an old tree stump but, being nowhere near the other pots in the garden, I have to admit that I frequently forget to water it. Elsewhere I have a few sempervivums in a shallow pot, and the thought occurred to me that I could move these to the tin bath and add a few more. They are virtually indestructible and will thrive on the inevitable neglect. I am going to create a crevice garden in the tub, a far more interesting way of growing these (or other alpine plants) than a traditional rock garden.

Alpine plants that come from rocky habitats have extensive root systems that can penetrate through crevices to reach moisture and nutrients deep down. The concept of a crevice garden is very simple: instead of a pile of hefty rocks on a mound of earth, it is constructed from flat stones set vertically and close together to create a series of narrow, deep crevices for the plants to grow in. They contain more rock than a rock garden (typically 50% more rock than soil) and the crevices are very narrow, as little as ½ to 1 inch. The aim is to create something that looks like rock strata that have been naturally lifted and tilted vertically or at a very slight tilt from vertical. The stones need to be flat to be able to create narrow crevices. Broken slate can look very effective for a tiny crevice garden in a pot and, on a grand scale in the garden, broken paving slabs can be used. They look best if they are in a mounded shape and, if in a container, mounded above the rim.

I will only need tiny plants for those narrow crevices, and I will wash the soil off the roots before planting, partly to be able to squeeze them into the crevices and partly because they are often planted in unsuitable compost. The crevices guide the roots downward, creating a deep, drought-resistant root system which is insulated from heat and cold. The crevices will be filled with a fast-draining nutrient-poor sand and grit mixture or with an equal mixture of John Innes No.2 and grit and topped with gravel, allowing water to drain away quickly leaving the crowns dry and preventing them from rotting in wet weather. I am planning to place the stones diagonally across the tub, which looks more interesting than straight across.



Crevice gardens can be huge affairs or can be exquisite scaled-down creations in a pot or trough – a sort of bonsai version of a mountain. Unlike some of my other projects, this one should be fun and easy to create (and cheap too) and I should be able to produce something presentable in just a couple of hours.




