

Blackwater Benefice Ministry Team Message



SO here we are in October....very much a month when little seems to happen.

The Last Night of the Proms – the closing act of summer in my book – is already forgotten.

All Saints Day, All Souls Day, Remembrance Sunday and Advent all lie ahead on the path to Christmas.

Outside the days are growing darker and gloomier (probably! Who dares to predict the weather at this time of Global Warming!) The nights are drawing in and I find once again in my head the nagging memory of those so evocative words from one of T.S.Eliot's Preludes:

"The burnt-out ends of smoky days. And now a gusty shower wraps The grimy scraps Of withered leaves about your feet."

But hey-up! Wait a minute! We're Christians. With God within us and beside us, there will always be hope. The light of His love will shine bright in our hearts in even the darkest days.

During the course of this month (Trinity 17) we will hear as a Gospel; reading Luke's account of how Jesus cured ten lepers. One of them returns to thank Jesus who tells him: "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

This is one of those simple, straightforward little passages in which the miracle seems the point. But it's not really, is it? The true point is the "your faith has made you well."

Jesus presents Himself here as a kind of conduit; He has "cured" the other nine lepers, but the one who returned had the faith to cure himself, and it only needed Jesus's presence for him to be able to unlock that faith.

We see this happening time and again through the Gospels: The onus is on us. Not on God. Not on Jesus. If our Faith is strong enough, if our Belief is good enough, and if our actions act out those qualities in our daily lives, we have the means, through God, of overcoming the metaphorical ills that daily threaten to drag us down.

Act with humility (the message from Trinity 14 and 15); Repent of our sins (Trinity 16); Be honest and trustworthy (Trinity 17).

Through this period of His mission Jesus is teaching us lessons in the Love of God to which we must all adhere if we are, eventually, to enter the Kingdom of God.

So, far from being a quiet time in our Christian life, the concluding passage of time in Trinity is vital to us.

"Not everyone that said to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that does the will of my Father which is in heaven" we are told in Matthew, Chapter 7, verse 21).

As we proceed through October, the days ahead may seem dark and in keeping with a rather cynical saying I have heard: "Because of budget cuts the light at the end of the tunnel has been turned off."

But for us the light of God always awaits.

"I am the light of the World," we find Jesus saying in John Chapter 8. "Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

And then again, referring directly to us, during the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew Chapter 5) Jesus declares to His audience: "You are the light of the world.....let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven."

A message to remember as the days are drawing in.

News from the Belfry

As the cooler weather approaches and we rush to don our woolly jumpers we can perhaps dwell on the importance of the medieval wool trade in our region and its influence on church architecture. A wool church was financed primarily by donations from rich merchants and farmers who had benefitted from the wool trade in the late 14th and 15th century. They hoped that their generosity would ensure a place in heaven. Wool churches are common in the Cotswolds and in the wool towns of East Anglia where enormous profits from the wool business spurred construction of ever grander edifices. A wool church was often built to replace a smaller or less imposing church and also to reflect the growing prosperity of the community. Many such building projects were undertaken by a small number of families in each village or town, who used the new church building to display their own wealth, status and faith. The building of wool churches largely ended with the English Reformation and the simultaneous decline of the wool trade between 1525 and 1600. Notable wool churches in East Anglia include those at Long Melford, Lavenham, Saffron Walden, Ipswich and Thaxted but the nearest wool church to visit is Saint Peter ad Vincula at Coggeshall. This church stands on the site of former Saxon and Norman churches. It is one of the largest in Essex, only preceded by the churches at Saffron Walden and Thaxted. It shares its name with the chapel in the Tower of London the rare dedication to St Peter-ad-Vincula (St Peter in Chains) and was built in the 15th Century, a prosperous time in Coggeshall's history, with its wealthy wool merchants pouring money into the building of the church. At one time the church was considered to become the Cathedral Church of Essex before Chelmsford was chosen.

Thomas Paycocke, a wealthy Coggeshall wool merchant, was responsible for most of the building we see today. He was born in the second half of the 15th century, and he became a successful businessman, making a small fortune by outsourcing the manufacture of woollen cloth. The family was solely responsible for St Catherine's chapel which stands to the north of the chancel. Memorial brasses in the floor include the ones of John Paycocke and his wife Joan, dating from 1533. There is a brass of Thomas Paycocke who died in 1580 and left a charity "for the continuall relief of the poore of Coxall for ever".

On the night of September 16th 1940 a stray bomb exploded in the churchyard near the tower. The north arcade collapsed and brought down the roof of the nave. The huge east window was untouched as was the rood screen surmounted by its cross. The two soldiers who had been on watch duty on the tower roof were knocked over by the blast but were otherwise uninjured. The bells were undamaged but over the next few days the tower began to collapse and this left the bell frame partly unsupported and in danger of falling. An enterprising local policeman and his colleagues managed to lower the bells to the ground. In the autumn of 1943 the war time ban on bell ringing was lifted

they were only formerly to be used to signal an invasion. Work began on erecting a temporary building in the churchyard where the bells could be rung. This work was promoted and organised again by a local policeman and just a few days after the work was finished in May 1945, the bells were rung for the first time to celebrate Victory in Europe Day. The millennium saw the addition of two new bells to the peal of eight. These bells were cast by bell founders John Taylor & Sons. The oldest bell is the fifth bell cast in 1681 by Miles Graye III The new bell wheels were made by Andrew Beckwith and the one wheel for the tenor bell, which weighed over 1.25 tons, was over 7 feet in diameter. The task of taking down and re-hanging the bells was undertaken by the ringers themselves.

August 15th marked the eightieth anniversary of VJ Day commemorating the cessation of all hostilities in World War Two. Ten Great Totham ringers were joined by two ringers from Kelvedon to ring call changes, Plain Hunt and Plain Bob Doubles prior to the usual Friday practice night.

The much anticipated Promenade Park Management Plan has officially been signed off by the Council, heralding the beginning of a new era for one of our community's most cherished green spaces.

This strategic document, shaped by months of collaboration, public consultation and expert insight, will guide the stewardship, preservation and enhancement of Promenade Park for years to come. The Park is to be a place for relaxation, recreation, natural beauty and cultural events, all underpinned by sound environmental stewardship. The plan details a phased approach to improvements across Promenade Park, with a number of projects being planned over the next two years. These projects include improvements to our Secret Garden play area and the kiosks serving food, together with new facilities, including an outdoor gym, covered seating area, a nature trail, biodiversity areas, litter bins and free public wi-fi.

Maldon District Council has announced that the demolition of the former classroom building at Hythe Quay is set to commence after the Heritage Weekend, in line with requests from community representatives. The building is being taken down due to structural concerns, rendering it unsafe for continued use and it is beyond economical repair. Sadly, refurbishment is not possible given the original construction methods employed. We will develop an alternative use for the site, with consultation with the residents.

The business cases for Local Government Reorganisation have been submitted to Government. The Government will then make a decision on which cases will be put to residents for consultation, before any final decision is made. I will make sure I keep you informed.

Maldon Library is one of several locations around Essex that is taking part in a free blood pressure scheme. Here's what's available:

Great Totham






