Dear Friends

Grace, Love and Fellowship

If I asked you to quote from Paul's 2nd Letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 13 verse 13, I wonder if you could do so? But if I said, "Let's say 'The Grace'" far more would know what to say.

"May the **grace** of our Lord Jesus Christ, the **love** of God and the **fellowship** of the Holy Spirit be with us all evermore".

As those words trip easily off our tongues, I am struck by the fact that in that one verse we find three of the defining characteristics of Christian faith.

Grace is amazing! The God revealed by Jesus is a God of total grace. He doesn't love us because we are good enough (any of us) and He doesn't cease to love us whatever we do. He chooses to love us freely and without condition. This, incidentally, is why following Jesus is not about "religion". Religion is what we do to try to get closer to God. We don't need to; in Jesus, God comes close to us!

And through grace, we discover just how much God **loves** us. Love is the 2nd of our great Christian truths. I was a bit alarmed to read in the Daily Telegraph (so, it must be true!) that a prominent politician has "given up on God" but is still a "cultural Christian". Sorry, but you can't be a Christian of any sort if you don't believe in God (That's like being vegan but still enjoying the occasional bacon sandwich!) We proclaim that God is real – and is all about Love.

Once we learn about God's amazing grace and begin to respond to His love, it is hardly surprising that we seek out others who share our faith. And that leads us to the 3rd extraordinary thing about the followers of Jesus – we seek out a community of faith. And this is the **fellowship** that has always defined the church. Fellowship isn't actually a great translation of the Greek word "koinonia", but it's the best word that English can give us. God calls us with His grace, reveals His love and places us within a huge multi-cultural, multi-national, multi-lingual, all-age community of believers.

Church is not a place we go to – it's a family to which we choose to belong.

After 20+ years among you, I have learned many things about myself and about our faith in Jesus who uniquely reveals God.

As I take my leave and begin the next stage of discipleship and ministry, I pray that we would all know God's grace, receive His love and rejoice to be part of the community of faith.

"May the **grace** of our Lord Jesus Christ, the **love** of God and the **fellowship** of the Holy Spirit be with us all evermore". AMEN.

Redlynch and Local District history Society Talks Programme 2025-26

2 September - "The Man in the Picture? – Finding my uncle's RAF past" by Robert Inns.

Bob describes his journey and advice for finding his relatives RAF service history and what they experienced.

7 October - History of Communication by Phil Whitemore.

This presentation ranges from jungle drums, to semaphore, to the humble telephone and on to present day mobile phones, outlining the changes in technology on the way. Presented in a way that everyone can understand.

4 November - "The Brick Revolution": Courtier Houses in Tudor Wiltshire, by Graham Bathe.

After the Romans departed, brick was rare in Britain for over a thousand years. In the Tudor period, the ability to build ostentatious brick palaces at breakneck speed set a runaway new trend. Brick became the fashionable material of choice, first seen in Wiltshire at showpiece stately homes. This talk will attempt to identify the first records of brick in the county and assess its impact on the county.

2 December - "The Duke of Monmouth – how his head was turned and lost" Jacqueline and Brian Sutton.

We explore the rise and fall of the Duke of Monmouth in this fascinating and well researched 1 hour PowerPoint presentation. The story covers the Royal characters behind the Duke's story, the Battle of Sedgemoor 1685 and its aftermath including the Bloody Assize, the trial of Alice Lisle of Ringwood and the Duke's eventual execution.

6 January - The Lost Mansions of Whiteparish by Rosalind Johnson.Whiteparish suffered the loss of three major houses: the St Barbe manor

house (the site is now the doctors' surgery car park), Broxmore House and Cowesfield House. Additionally, the original Brickworth House was badly damaged by fire in the mid-19th c. and substantially rebuilt.

3 February - Wings Over the Forest: The New Forest's Aviation Pioneers by Marc Heighway.

The New Forest has a rich aviation history; from the early dreamers and inventors, to the pioneers of Great War aircraft. This presentation explores the innovative spirit of those magnificent men and their flying machines. Marc Heighway presents tales of adventure, bravery, sacrifice, plus many strange inventions that didn't quite take flight.

3 March - Romans in the Avon Valley by Adrian Green from Salisbury Museum.

The talk includes the Roman history of Downton, Cranborne, New Forest and Salisbury.

7 April - Built heritage by Wessex Archaeology.

5 May - Milestones by Jamie Hobson, from Salisbury Museum.

A look at the subject focused mainly on milestones, directional signs and boundary stones in and around Salisbury with occasional excursions into the weirdness of Cornish milestones. It focuses on typography, typology, numerals, manicules and the magnificent work of Kinneir and Calvert.

2 June - Airfield Visit to Old Sarum Airfield Museum Boscombe Down Aviation Collection.

An early evening visit.


