Reflection: Sunday 21st September 2025 Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity

The book of Proverbs consists of hundreds of short, clever sayings designed to teach us how to live and act wisely. Each saying touches on a common area of life and shows us what it's like to live well in God's world. This week's reading concerns wisdom.

We live in a time when information is everywhere, but wisdom is rare. With so much conflicting and downright false information, wisdom, rooted in God's Word, offers clarity and stability in the way we make our choices. It offers believers a way to navigate moral dilemmas, relationships, and decisions in our modern culture, which often elevates wealth, status, and possessions above all else. This passage challenges Christians to pursue those gifts that cannot be bought - wisdom, integrity, and spiritual depth.

Wisdom promises peace of mind. In an age marked by 'influencers', many paid by advertisers, anxiety and restlessness are rife and self belief is plummeting. The peace of mind that comes from following in God's truth brings inner rest that the world, for all its material trappings, cannot offer.

Wisdom doesn't just benefit the individual; it blesses families, communities, and future generations. Christians are called to share and pass on godly wisdom in a modern culture hungry for truth.

Proverbs reminds us that wisdom is not just knowing facts - it is lining up the way we live our lives with God's truth. Wisdom is more precious than silver or gold because whilst money can buy material success, it cannot give peace, righteousness, or eternal life. As Christians, we recognise that Jesus is the epitome of God's wisdom. To seek wisdom is to seek Him. He offers what the world cannot: deep peace, direction, and the promise of eternal life. When we embrace God's wisdom, we are really holding onto Christ - the true Tree of Life, rooted in God's ways and with the fruits of peace, understanding, tolerance, and many other gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Amos 8.4-7

4 Hear this, you that trample on the needy,
and bring to ruin the poor of the land,
5 saying, 'When will the new moon be over
so that we may sell grain; and the sabbath,
so that we may offer wheat for sale? We will make the
ephah small and the shekel great,
and practise deceit with false balances,
6 buying the poor for silver
and the needy for a pair of sandals,
and selling the sweepings of the wheat.'
7 The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will
never forget any of their deeds.

1 Timothy 2.1-7

1 First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers,
intercessions, and thanksgivings should be made for
everyone,
2 for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we
may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and
dignity.
3 This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our
Saviour,
4 who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the
knowledge of the truth.
5 For there is one God;
there is also one mediator between God and
humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human,
6 who gave himself a ransom for all-this was attested at
the right time.
7 For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am
telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles
in faith and truth.

Luke 16.1-13

16 Then Jesus said to the disciples, 'There was a rich man
who had a manager, and charges were brought to him
that this man was squandering his property.
2 So he summoned him and said to him, "What is this
that I hear about you? Give me an account of your
management, because you cannot be my manager any
longer."
3 Then the manager said to himself, "What will I do,
now that my master is taking the position away from
me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to
beg.
4 I have decided what to do so that, when I am
dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into
their homes."
5 So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he
asked the first, "How much do you owe my master?"
6 He answered, "A hundred jugs of olive oil." He said to
him, "Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty."

7 Then he asked another, "And how much do you owe?"
He replied, "A hundred containers of wheat." He said to
him, "Take your bill and make it eighty."

8 And his master commended the dishonest manager
because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this
age are more shrewd in dealing with their own
generation than are the children of light.

9 And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of
dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may
welcome you into the eternal homes.

10 'Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in
much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is
dishonest also in much.

11 If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest
wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches?

12 And if you have not been faithful with what belongs
to another, who will give you what is your own?

13 No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either
hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the
one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and
wealth.'

Bible Readings:

Deuteronomy 26.1-11

1 When you have come into the land that the Lord your
God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you
possess it, and settle in it,

2 you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the
ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord
your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket
and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose
as a dwelling for his name.

3 You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time,
and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your God
that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our
ancestors to give us.'

4 When the priest takes the basket from your hand and
sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God,

5 you shall make this response before the Lord your
God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went
down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in
number, and there he became a great nation, mighty
and populous.

6 When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted
us, by imposing hard labour on us,

7 we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the
Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and
our oppression.

8 The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand
and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of
power, and with signs and wonders;

9 and he brought us into this place and gave us this
land, a land flowing with milk and honey.

10 So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that
you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before

the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God.

11 Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

Philippians 4.4-9

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice.

5 Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near.

6 Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. 8 Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.

9 Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Revelation 14.14-18

14 Then I looked, and there was a white cloud, and seated on the cloud was one like the Son of Man, with a golden crown on his head, and a sharp sickle in his hand!

15 Another angel came out of the temple, calling with a loud voice to the one who sat on the cloud, 'Use your sickle and reap, for the hour to reap has come, because the harvest of the earth is fully ripe.'

16 So the one who sat on the cloud swung his sickle over the earth, and the earth was reaped.

17 Then another angel came out of the temple in heaven, and he too had a sharp sickle.

18 Then another angel came out from the altar, the angel who has authority over fire, and he called with a loud voice to him who had the sharp sickle, 'Use your sharp sickle and gather the clusters of the vine of the earth, for its grapes are ripe.'

John 6.25-35

25 When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?'

26 Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves.'

27 Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.'

28 Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?'

29 Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent.'

30 So they said to him, 'What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing?'

31 Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat."

32 Then Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven.'

33 For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

34 They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.'

35 Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.'

Marmalade, Jam, Tinned potatoes, Coffee (small jars), Dried potatoes (Smash), Biscuits, Crisps, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned chickpeas, mixed chilli beans, lentils, Custard, Tinned rice pudding, Sachet meals (pan or microwave), 'No Cook' meals for the homeless, Cordial.

They also need:

Fray Bentos pies, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Pasta sauce, Corned beef, Tinned ham, Crackers, Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Sugar (500g), Tinned sausages with beans, Tinned peas, Tinned ham, Tinned fruit, Tinned vegetarian meals, such as veggie chilli, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/ juice, Hot dogs (tins or jars), Tinned red meat: mince, stew, Bolognese, chilli, Microwave puddings, Pasta sauce, Peanut butter, Chicken in sauce, Tinned carrots, Tinned pasta, Tinned sweetcorn, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Oxford. As part of the 'Chaplaincy Lectures', a joint initiative between the Bishop of Leicester and universities in Leicester and Loughborough, we are delighted to announce the next lecture will take place at **Loughborough University on Thursday 30th October 2025**.

The lecture will be given by the Professor Lord Tarassenko entitled *'Will we still need God when we reach Artificial General Intelligence?'*

Professor Lord (Lionel) Tarassenko CBE FEng FMedSci is the first president of Reuben College. He was appointed as a non-party-political peer in the House of Lords in May 2024.
