Thought for Thursday

Thought for Thursday: The Cost of Discipleship and Generous Giving

Jesus reminds us that discipleship is costly — but costly doesn't mean miserable. Sometimes, money and faith make us squirm, but at its heart, generosity is about freedom, joy, and choosing life (Deut. 30). Generosity isn't just about giving to the church; it's about how we share our resources with family, friends, and those in need. Think of generosity like spiritual exercise: much like a gym membership, it costs, but it gives life and joy.

Discipleship often means surrender, and surrender brings joy (Luke 14:33). Paul reminds us that giving flows from love, not guilt. Everything we have belongs to God first; we are stewards, not owners. Take a moment to reflect: if you looked back over your giving this year — to family, to charity, to your community, or to organisations you support — would you feel joyful and grateful, or would you barely notice it? Sometimes, like our Netflix habits, we only realise the impact of what we've given after the fact — and if we don't notice it, we may miss out on the joy.

There are different ways of giving. Opportunistic giving is like finding a fiver in your pocket — it's great in the moment, but unreliable. Regular giving is like watering plants — little and often keeps things alive. Planned giving goes even further, saying, "God, I trust you first, and

I'll organise my life around that." Starting the year with this mindset allows us to give joyfully from our increase.

How much should we give? The Old Testament tithe of 10% is a helpful guide, but the New Testament calls us to generosity and sacrifice. Think of generosity like cooking for friends — you don't measure three peas per guest; you pour it in with love. Giving is not seasonal; it's part of discipleship. Imagine having to share publicly what you gave last year — to family, to charity, or to causes you care about — how would you feel? Embarrassed? Proud? Joyful? This isn't about guilt, but about the joy of knowing you've blessed others and supported the communities and causes that matter.

Generosity is not doom and gloom — it's one of the most joyful, freeing ways to live. What's your attitude to giving? Is it an afterthought, or part of your discipleship plan? Living generously creates ripples of joy, and together, in all areas of our lives, we reflect the generosity of God to the world.
