


Prayer, Bible, Church

Since the 1960s, like other parts of the West, the UK has been undergoing a significant shift in our religious identity. We are moving from a view of faith as an expression of national identity, i.e. "I live in a Christian country, I was born here, therefore I am Christian" to considering faith as a practice, i.e. "I read the Bible, I go to Church, I follow Jesus, and I pray, therefore I am a Christian."

This shift has two key implications. Firstly, it explains why fewer people in recent decades declare themselves Christian in polls and censuses. Secondly, it's prompting people to think more deeply about what it means to be a Christian in a more religiously diverse Britain.

At the time of the 2021 census, we already knew from other surveys that only 6% of the UK population (c. 4,200,000 people) considered their Christian faith as a practice as well as a belief. We could see this anecdotally too. If your community is typical of the national picture then in a village of 100 people, 6 people will be attending church, reading the Bible and praying on a regular basis. In a town of 10,000 then 600 people will be practicing Christians in the same way.

However, things are changing. Richard Dawkins may well be describing himself as a 'cultural Christian' these days, because he values our ancient buildings, and the Christian landscape of our nation, but more people, especially younger people, are considering the Christian faith as their 'belief in practice'. The landscape is changing. 'Cultural Christianity' is not enough for many, and instead faith as 'belief in practice' is on the rise.

Not only are more people finding the person of Jesus utterly compelling, but more people are finding the practices of the Christian faith as offering much needed constancy and reassurance in a world that has felt increasingly fractured and unstable.

For me it is a reminder of how important prayer is in our everyday lives. I wonder if, during this autumn season characterized by nature returning to the earth and our preparation for another harvest year, we should give time to renewing the practices of our Christian faith. Perhaps this is the time to return to our roots in prayer and scripture.

Before Holy Cross in Crediton was a parish church, it was the cathedral church for Devon and Cornwall, a house of worship for all. Before there was a cathedral church there was a monastery in Crediton– a house of prayer. The deepest foundations of our ancient churches are not the stone structures, but the history of people who desired to pray and worship God.

While I am immensely grateful for the privileges of growing up in a country with a Christian heritage and history, being merely a cultural Christian does not excite me, nor does it feel an appropriate response to that rich inheritance I have received. Taking on the practices, habits, and rhythms of those who laid the ground seems far more appropriate. So, this month's article is really about prayer, about reading the Bible, and about going to church. That's it. The more we do it and the more we pledge our lives to Christ, and give God the glory he deserves, the more it will shape our country and our common life for the better.







Mission Shed: What it means for parishes to have missional DNA

Missional DNA is one of Bishop Mike's five priorities. Our October Mission Shed Living God's Future Now, in collaboration with St Martin-in-the-Field's HeartEdge movement, will help is think through what having missional DNA really means. It will encourage us as church communities to think, pray, and do mission out of abundance, not scarcity. It will help mission communities to discover and use their inherent gifts and assets to become more dynamic, engaged, and inclusive spaces for growth, partnership, and community transformation. Could you bring a group from your church?

Jeremy Putnam, Diocesan Mission Enabler, said, "Mission Shed's are normally free events that encourage discussion and learning on topics of mission. Our Mission Shed in October is a ticketed event due to it being catered, as well as being an all day event, and with a concert in the evening. Supported by Heartedge in partnership with he Diocese of Exeter, there will be great discussion, great speakers, and world-class musicians and singers. This day will move you, it will get you thinking, and will encourage all of us to consider how we live God's future today.

This day of inspiration and renewal will include...

HeartEdge: Practical workshops exploring the 4 Cs (Compassion, Commerce, Culture, and Congregation) for creating flourishing churches. When scarcity could so easily dictate our thinking, instead we shift to an abundance mindset, and a belief that God provides more than they need.

Great Sacred Music: Great Sacred Music is a 35-minute sequence of words and music which explores through song and readings the great classical music of our religious heritage. It is a model that can be replicated and it has successfully engaged a wide spectrum of attendees.

Being With: Being With is a life changing way to help people explore the Christian faith. Being With helps people consider Christian faith in new and refreshing ways, without needing prior knowledge, but a simple willingness to share what you do know or feel.

Theological Input from Sam Wells: Grounding the day in rich theological reflection. Interactive Sermon Preparation: Engaging clergy and lay leaders in live, collaborative sermon crafting.

HeartBeat: offers resources for worship including a weekly reflection linked to the lectionary readings and a set of open questions for a small group to explore the scripture passages.

Bread for the World: Closing the day with an Act of Contemplative and Contemporary Worship to give thanks for the sense of God's presence and refreshment we have experienced in our time together.

St Martin's Choral Scholars will perform a concert in the evening at nearby St James the Apostle, parish church at 6.3 opm which will offer a chance to enjoy the musical talents of these gifted young people. Locally prepared curries will be available in the church between the conference and concert for a donation towards the church.

Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.



GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

The Crediton Music Endowment Fund was established to promote the study, practice and improvement of music making at Holy Cross. It contributes towards the cost of the music staff and makes grants towards the cost of music lessons for the junior choristers (singing and playing). It raises funds through music events (the most recent being 'Bach to Broadway') and has further events coming up – a jazz evening on Wednesday 8 October and a 'Come and Sing' choral workshop ending with a performance of 'The Armed Man' on Saturday 8 November.

On Saturday 4 October at 4pm, we are holding a short Pet Service to include a blessing in the churchyard (in church if inclement weather) followed by refreshments. If you don't think your pet is suitable to bring, bring a photo! This is also the day on which we remember St Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals. 
