Remembering Together

AT this time of year we do a fair bit of remembering, and we do it together. At All Souls time we remember that generations of people have gone through life before us. As we remember those who have died in the recent or more distant past we do so with thanksgiving and a desire to go forward well. Similarly Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day give us an opportunity to remember those fallen during war. We remember with the intention of moving into the future having learned the lessons of the past and with a renewed desire for peace. As Christians we remember as a habit. Although it is not the only thing we do during Holy Communion, as we

share in bread and wine remember Jesus Christ's death and resurrection for us. Not only that but we are to maintain the practice of remembering all of God's deeds in the past, his presence now and his promises for the future. When we do all these sorts of remembering we take a personal look at the past and present, and make personal commitments for the future. However, we also crucially remember together. Why is that important? Remembering together helps us look back well and move forward well. The life of faith involves plenty of remembering but we don't just stop at that. Every day we seek to serve our God and we should want to do so well. Knowing stuff,

whether it's things of the past or present realities, is helpful but it's not the be all and end of all of life! Christianity is active and so we're called to put what we know into action. However, remembering and then putting things that we know into action is quite difficult on our own. We benefit from having others around us who can spur us on. As the writer to the Hebrews says in his sermon-letter:

'Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on towards love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another and all the more as you see the Day approaching' (Hebrews 10:23-25). Holding 'unswervingly' to the hope we profess involves knowing

Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally to become 106th Archbishop of Canterbury

HIS Majesty The King has approved the nomination of the Bishop of London, the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally, as the next Archbishop of Canterbury.

The 106th Archbishop of Canterbury since Saint Augustine arrived in Kent from Rome in 597, Bishop Sarah will be the first woman to hold the office. She will be installed during a special service at Canterbury Cathedral in March 2026.

The most senior bishop in the Church of England, the Archbishop of Canterbury's ministry combines many roles including serving as the Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, as well as primus inter pares – or first among equals – of the Primates of the global Anglican Communion, which consists of around 85 million people, across 165 countries.

Bishop Sarah said: "As I respond to the call of Christ to this new ministry, I do so in the same spirit of service to God and to others that has motivated me since I first came to faith as a teenager

"At every stage of that journey, through my



nursing career and Christian ministry, I have learned to listen deeply – to people and to God's gentle prompting – to seek to bring people together to find hope and healing.

"I want, very simply, to encourage the Church to continue to grow in confidence in the Gospel, to speak of the love that we find in Jesus Christ and for it to shape our actions.

"And I look forward

to sharing this journey of faith with the millions of people serving God and their communities in parishes all over the country and across the global Anglican Communion.

"I know this is a huge responsibility but I approach it with a sense of peace and trust in God to carry me as He always has."
