

Pastoral
Letter
Robert writes





My dear friends

It is a long time since I wrote a September Parish Letter, 2021 in fact, at the end of Covid lock down, restrictions were easing, and we found ourselves with a new "normal". It all seems a long time ago now, though we still have a few legacy practices that will take a while to disappear.

By and large we now meet in large groups with little concern. Indeed, my wife Jane and I went to see the Edinburgh Military Tattoo in August, having booked a "Lochs & Glens" (other travel companies are available) short holiday which included the event. A long-held wish was fulfilled.

Having been, I was struck by the difference between watching it on TV and being there. Normally one has a better view on TV, but I have to say that is not necessarily so in this case. From where we sat, I was able to see the intricate patterns of drill followed by the bands when they left the main arena as the next item began at the far end. The atmosphere was wonderful too as the terraces were completely full of spectators enjoying the spectacle.

Being a "Shed Head" at Gloucester Rugby I know only too well the difference between "being there" and watching remotely. For me atmosphere is everything.

It is similar with church services. Being present and taking part in services, especially those such as Reverend Daniel's Ordination, are experiences to treasure for long periods afterwards. I would be a rich person financially if I were given a pound for every time I hear someone say, "you don't have to go to church to be a Christian". Yet how many would say "you don't have to go and watch a football match at Old Trafford to be to be a Manchester United fan". You don't, but the commitment and experiences, and the resulting memories, are so much the less, are are they not?

Sometimes the lack of attending church causes all sorts of worries and concerns, especially for those who have either never been or have not been for a very long time. I have found that so many have very strange and restrictive ideas of etiquette and perceptions of what is, and is not, acceptable especially for funerals and memorial services. This is particularly so in terms of music choices. Can we play this? Can we have that? Are we allowed to play music by such and such artist or band? The reality is that, as far as I know, no music is specifically banned from use in church, though taste and decorum may suggest certain tracks are better played at the refreshments or family gathering afterwards where they can be enjoyed more readily.

This brings me to the point that, no matter how often or recently anyone has been in church, there is always a welcome for you. Yes, the regulars will be well practiced in the structure of the service, and you may feel a bit lost by comparison, but you will be helped if you if we see you need it. I am mindful here of the words spoken to Harry Potter by Dumbledore "Help will always be given at Hogwarts for those who ask for it".

I hope that, if you have read this letter, and feel that you just *might* like to come along, then please do. After all, there is nothing like *being there* is there?

Meet the Bishop's Advisor for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing

We are delighted to welcome Philippa Donald as the Bishop's Advisor for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

Philippa started learning British Sign Language (BSL) in 2021, and she hopes to use her skills to be a friendly point of contact for anyone seeking to explore the Christian faith or find a church community.

She said: "I'm very excited and honoured to be taking on the role of 'Bishop's Advisor for the deaf and hard of hearing' in the Diocese of Gloucester. It has been one of the desires of my heart for some time, to see our churches and church services becoming more accessible to those with whom we cannot communicate in the traditional way of speaking and being heard.

"British Sign Language has its own alphabet. There is a sign for each letter, but most words have their own sign, and some signs can work for several words

"The sentence structure in BSL is also different from English, and all elements must work together – including facial expressions, which convey the mood of what you are signing. It can be challenging, but it's very rewarding when someone understands your efforts to communicate

"The message of God's love and salvation for everyone needs to be able to be proclaimed to all, in a way that they can receive, understand and respond.

"Please pray for me as I begin this exciting new role, that it will enable more people to hear the good news of Jesus Christ for themselves and begin or continue their journey of faith."

Welcoming people into church this month

As schools reopen and daily routines restart after the summer months, September can be a time when people decide to explore new activities or connect with local community groups, including getting involved with church. It's a good time to think about welcome, particularly for new people in an area who might be looking for community and connection.

Robin Riordan, Churchwarden in Tidenham Parish, shares how the churches in Tidenham parish – St Luke's in Tutshill, St Mary and St Peter's in Tidenham, and St Michael and All Angels in Tidenham Chase – welcome people in and aim to make everyone feel included.

Openness is at the heart of all three churches in the parish. We want anyone who comes in to feel like they are part of the church family. We are always happy to welcome new members and grow.

We have a welcoming team, alongside sidespeople. There's always someone greeting people as they arrive, and others who continue the welcome inside. When new people come through the door, several people will say hello and chat with them. We try to create a space where everyone feels noticed and at ease.

We have coffee on offer after some services, to give people a chance to meet and chat. We also run activities in the community that are non-faith based, like coffee mornings, baby and toddler groups, Pilates in the church building, and music evenings. These are ways people can get to know the church without needing to come to a service first.

We have strong links with our local primary school; the schoolchildren sometimes do assemblies at the church. The families become familiar with us through combined activities like this.

We make sure to be visible in the community through our website and Facebook page. Being approachable helps people feel comfortable reaching out or dropping in.

Our goal is that when anyone walks through the doors, whether they come once or regularly, they feel welcome and part of something friendly and supportive.

Ride and Stride is back for 2025

Ride and Stride is back, for 2025, taking place on 13 September. This annual event invites people across Gloucestershire and North Bristol to visit churches by walking, cycling, horse-riding or using public transport to raise money. Funds raised are split between the participant's chosen church and Gloucestershire Historic Churches Trust (GHCT) which provides grants for vital repair and improvement work. In 2024, Ride and Stride raised over £36,000, supporting projects such as roof repairs, fire door replacements and improved wheelchair access. 




