### The Silent Auction in figures

In Total there were **307** Lots given by **30** Households

The Total of lots bid for and sold was **119** so about **39%**The Lots sold went to **38** different households

Total raised was **£856.66** which is **£31** more than at our first Silent Auction

The lots that didn't sell have either been returned to the donor, given to Julia's House and to Oxfam Charity Shops, given to the Group 5 Charity or found new homes for on Olio. We aren't aware of anything that had to be thrown away and I am very pleased to announce that even the lonely little chair left at St Mary's has now been found a new good home. Many thanks to all who supported the Auction in whatever way — it is very much appreciated.

Unfortunately, looking at the Finances for Hilperton and Staverton Parish for this year, £856 is just a drop in the ocean as I'm afraid we are now forecasting a deficit of about £12,000 by the end of 2025. Having said that your generosity has always proved the Treasurer's bleak forecasts wrong in the past and you are very welcome to prove him wrong again this year!

### **Thought from Joy**

When reading the Bible, especially the Old Testament or Hebrew Bible, I am constantly struck by the importance placed on remembering. Both the ancient Jews and early Christians constantly told and retold their stories as a way of embedding them in memory. This ancient oral tradition of constantly reciting

their history, stories and lineage, was passed from parent to child, teacher to pupil for a thousand years, long before any written records were made.

For the ancient Israelites, hearing these accounts repeated time after time, was as important as the telling of them. The Jewish prayer the Shema Yisrail, begins in Hebrew, "Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone" (Deuteronomy 6:4). When it comes down to the most important things we need to learn, whether from God, our teachers or even our families, we are called upon to listen and to remember.

The beginning of November each year is a time of remembering and remembrance in our churches. On the first Sunday of the month, as close as possible to All Souls Day, we remember all our loved ones who have departed this life to live on "another shore and in a greater light" (quote from the Bidding prayer commonly used at traditional carol services). In the annual service in St. Michael and All Angels' Church, those present are encouraged to listen as we read out the names of those who have died in the last three years, and any others that we are asked to recall, and those who mourn are invited to light a candle in their memory. This is a deeply moving and powerful service of remembering, especially as each person comes quietly forward to remember their loved ones. The acts of remembering and remembrance continue into the following week as our schools, churches and uniformed organisations, join the rest of the country in the Acts of Remembrance for those who have died in conflicts around the world. As again, we are invited to listen, as the names of those from our parishes recorded on our war memorials are solemnly read out. This year the services are on Sunday 9th November, beginning at 10am in St. George's Church, Semington; 10.50am in St. Michael and All Angels' Church, Hilperton; and 3pm in St. Mary the Virgin Church, Whaddon.

These annual services echo of the ancient tradition of remembering and recalling our history. They are important reminders of our pasts: where we have come from; and they are significant in helping us to look forward and to navigate our future.

So, this November, what or whom will you be remembering?

### **In Loving Memory for All Souls**

Our annual In Loving Memory Service will take place on Sunday 2nd November at St Michael's at 3pm. This is a Benefice wide Service at which we remember those we have loved and lost, and all are very welcome to join us. The names

of those whose funerals, memorial services or interments have taken place in the Benefice during the last three years will be read out during the service together with all those named in the Book of Remembrance at St Michael's. If there are others that you would like us to name during the service, please write their names on the list which is at the back of church or let Michael know by Friday 31<sup>st</sup> October.
