THE RECTOR'S LETTER: Protecting God's Creation

Dear Friends,

At this time of year many churches, and perhaps especially those in the countryside celebrate the Harvest. Whilst the traditions around giving thanks for bringing the Harvest home are probably centuries old, the addition of Harvest in the Church calendar is normally traced back to the Revd R S Hawker, a parish priest in Cornwall. He chose the 1st October 1843 as the first Harvest Thanksgiving. It soon became an annual celebration, and the Church of England officially recognised it as such in 1862.

For me Harvest thanksgiving is always one of the highlights of the year. I simply love seeing the generosity of people as they bring gifts to Church to be passed onto those in need through the Foodbank. In recent years the Church has also begun to encourage this time of year to reflect more widely on creation. Global weather patterns are clearly changing and perhaps more than ever we all need to think about the environment and what we as individuals might do to help protect it.

In 1989 the Orthodox Church introduced a "Time for Creation", stretching from 1st September to the feast of St Francis on 4th October. Since then, it has encouraged other churches to share this season and this was endorsed at the European Ecumenical Assembly in Sibiu, Romania in 2007. The assembly agreed that Creation Time "be dedicated to prayer for the protection of Creation and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles that reverse our contribution to climate change."

Prayer is of course vital, and it's at the heart of what it means to live the Christian life. But it seems to me, as we celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving this year, as we thank God for the gift of creation, and the gift of the harvest, we might think about we might pledge to do, as individuals and as a church, which can help the environment and "reverse our contribution to climate change."

For many years St. Paul's celebrated being an Eco-congregation and much was achieved by the congregation during that initiative. In England and Wales Eco-

congregations have now been superseded by the environmental charity ARocha's programme, known as Eco Church. The Eco Church Scheme is designed to get all parts our church life working to care for creation. It should help us to engage practically and spiritually, with people in our church and the community beyond. The scheme looks at Worship and teaching, management of church buildings, management of church land, community and global engagement and lifestyle and it's hoped that we can begin to work towards its award scheme soon. Our former work as an Eco-congregation will have given us an excellent start.

In the creation accounts in the book of Genesis, God places the man in the garden of Eden to "till it" and "keep it". This is a reminder to us that God wants us to care for and protect the world that he has created. As we celebrate with thanksgiving the harvest this year, perhaps we might all, as a way of thanking God, find out whether there is something different we can do to continue to help protect and care for the world.

DIOCESE OF CHICHESTER HARVEST APPEAL 2025

This year the Diocese of Chichester Harvest Appeal is for Friends of the Holy Land. The reason for this charitable focus will be plain to all of us who have been following the news since the October 7th Hamas attacks on Israel and the subsequent war in Gaza and beyond. Friends of the Holy Land is a UK-based, non-political, ecumenical Christian charity with a deep commitment to



sustaining a hopeful future for Palestinian Christians. Rooted in the mission of supporting the Christian presence in the land of Christ's birth, the charity also works with compassion across religious lines, providing humanitarian help to people of all faiths.

The funds raised through this year's appeal will go directly to support families facing severe deprivation. Access to food, healthcare, housing, and education is increasingly limited, as Palestinian communities suffer from the ongoing impact of war, political instability and economic breakdown. Friends of the Holy Land partners with trusted local churches and organisations to provide emergency aid, food, medical care, schooling, and job opportunities. Their work is not only a lifeline to individuals and families; it is a powerful witness to Christ's love in action—bridging divides, building peace, and sustaining hope.

In Gaza City and the surrounding areas, where conditions have become desperate, £25 can provide a hygiene kit for a displaced family, and £50 can deliver food to last a week. This emergency care is being given in addition to the long-term work of providing education, supporting employment, and advocating for the region's Christian community.

Thank you so much for being part of this effort to see over £10,000 raised to help people in severe need.

MONEY MATTERS

Firstly may I introduce myself as the new church Treasurer, having taken over from Rod Smith who skilfully and faithfully guided the church finances over many years including the Pandemic shutdown and then a major building project. You will usually find me most Sundays in the back row of the choir, so if you do wish to talk money matters just give me a few minutes to disrobe afterwards!

Money matters now just as it mattered for people of olden times, who also had bills to pay and other 'modern' pleasures such as food and drink and gym membership (yes, gym is derived from an ancient Greek word). So it is not surprising that money topics feature frequently in both the Old and New Testaments and so will crop up in sermons from time to time. St Paul's too has bills to pay, gas/electric etc, contribution to the Diocese for our Rector, plus the occasional special project, and although we are blessed with former members having left money in their wills, we still rely on current members for our finances.

Church funding has moved on from the days of passing a collection plate round during the service while the congregation fumble in their pockets for change. Today many give to God's work at St Paul's and elsewhere, through regular bank standing orders, or cashless by using the card readers at the back of church or in the Parish Centre. If you are one of them, then I thank you very much for your contributions and I would also encourage you both to review your giving if you have not changed it for a while, and also to Gift Aid it if you do not already (so the church can reclaim tax). If you are new to the church, or have just not got round to it, and would like to start giving, or have any other then do get in touch with church questions me in Treasurer@stpaulschichester.org.

This all can sound rather transactional, and yes we do have bills to pay but of course what we are really doing is offering something back to God in gratitude for our redemption through the saving work of Jesus on the cross. Whether we give our time, skills, expertise, or money, what really matters to God is a grateful thankful heart.
