

Church Yards

Our graveyards are important to us, they are the places we remember the people we love and can help in our grief. We are lucky as a benefice that our churches have graveyards that can be used for both traditional burials and burials of ashes. However, these church yards take a lot of time and effort to maintain. I would therefor like to extend a big thank you to all the people who helped with our Church Yard Tidy up days in September and to those who regularly care for our church yards as volunteers. We will be doing church yard tidy up days in the future so please keep and eye out for those dates. If you



would like to help more regularly with our church yard care please do be in touch.

To support and guid parishes in their care of graveyards, the Diocese produces the graveyard regulations which PCCs adopt. A full version of these can be found on the Diocesan website (Churchyard regulations The Diocese of Blackburn). The aim of these regulations are to preserve the graveyard for all current and future users, to preserve its historic characteristics and to guide parishes and users in the care and maintenance of the space. Part of these regulations include guidance on memorial stones as well as what can be left at graves. They unfortunately do not allow the leaving of additional statues, plaques, additional flower vases, lanterns or similar items and only really allow the leaving of flours. They also do not allow the planting of plants or shrubs within the grave space. As Parishes we are responsible to try and keep to these regulations which may sometimes result in items being removed from graves. If this is done by the church the items will be kept for a time and can be collected. I deeply apologies for any upset this may cause people. If you have any questions or would like to discuss any of these please do be in contact with me.

Our church yards are a gathering place as well as a place of mourning and celebration of the lives of those we love. To try and preserve and care for them it takes us working together.

United Benefice (Balderstone, Mellor & Samlesbury) Churchwarden's meeting

2nd September 2025

Present: Nathaniel Gilmour, Mary Shorthouse, Lloyd Brown, John Eastham & Paul Daunton.

Apologies: Ryan Dixon & Sarah Lees

The meeting opened with a thanks to Mary for hosting and a prayer.

- The Diocese Renewal program for the benefice starts with a meeting at Whalley Abbey on Wednesday 3rd Sept and Nathaniel will be attending with a member from each parish. Feedback from this initial meeting will be given to the concurrent PCC meeting planned for Tuesday 9th of September.
- 2. There has been a recent problem at Mellor church's graveyard regarding some damaged headstones. There was confusion over how this had happened resulting in an erroneous report of vandalism. The church wardens have agreed that in future all 'rocking tests' of graveyard headstones should be conducted with a church warden in attendance and that Parishes should ensure that the Diocese Churchyard Regulations notice is prominently displayed.
- 3. There was some discussion about how we manage our social media sites, and we agreed that future posts on these, other than those concerning services or church events, should be discussed with a church warden before publication.
- 4. Balderstone are hoping to set up a 'Friends of Balderstone church' group and it was felt that this may be a good idea for all parishes if successful.
- 5. Nathaniel is planning on having a 'Plough Monday' service in January 2026 to which local farmers would be invited to have their ploughs blessed, followed by refreshments a suitable venue needs to be found, but Sarah and John have some ideas for this.
- 6. It was suggested that we hold a dinner/dance event for the centenary mission weekend on Friday 11th of September 2026 and Mitton Fold was looked at, however the cost of this venue was felt to be very high. Another venue will be looked at and we are hoping to form a small working group of parishioners to help plan and organise the weekend.
- 7. Sam has asked to stand down from her church admin role due to other commitments, so it was agreed to approach Laura to see if she would be willing to pick up the extra tasks, otherwise the post will need advertising.
- 8. The Advent bible study course is to go ahead, with an option to do this online via Zoom or an inperson meeting depending on numbers it is hoped to provide details in next month's UB magazine.
- 9. The Pastoral scheme will be mentioned at the next PCC meeting to see what the next steps might be, and it was felt that this may become a natural part of the Renewal program discussions/plans.

The meeting closed with the Grace.

The next meeting is planned for the 16th of October 2025

Poised behind a music stand and holding a ukulele, Janet asked us if we all had song sheets and prepared notes which gave us a good indication of a proposed musical evening and that her talk would feature songs, but particularly, as Janet declared to us, "Stories of Hymns".

Being a member of Balderstone Church and a ukulele teacher of the Youth Ukulele Group, music is of great interest to Janet and has taught music in school to children from Reception class up to Year 6. Referring us to our notes, Janet talked about historical composers of famous hymns and asked we all join in to sing along with her.


We began with John Newton, the composer of "Amazing Grace" and Janet gave us some background and how the hymn came to be penned after a life, by his own admission and well published, of lack of morals and values, and an eventual conversion to Christianity after a near death drowning. The hymn became world famous and is sung by all faiths and religions.

Following on with the composer Carl Boberg, a Swedish preacher, who is known for many poems, hymns and gospel music, Janet referred us to one of his more famous hymns, "How great Thou Art". It was written in Swedish however after a passage of time translated into English and now a great favourite all over the UK.

Our evening continued with singing and interludes of facts of historical and modern composers including, George Bennard (The Old Rugged Cross), Cecil Frances Alexander (There is a Green Hill), Graham Kendrick (Servant King), and Kevin Mayhew, a student of Westminster Cathedral Choir School, and well known music publisher who composed "Peace Perfect Peace".

Members enjoyed the audience participation and Margaret Baldwin, (member and choirmaster at St Mary's church) seemed most pleased with our renditions. Margaret closed the evening by thanking Janet and offering her a small gift of our appreciation.

Hughes called Dogger. It's all about the loss of a soft toy and the anxiety that causes a small child. That attachment that we have with a toy when we are small is very strong. Even as adults we can still remember how secure and safe our favoured toy made us feel. Did you have one?

Our bible reading was Jesus' parable about the lost coin and how the woman searches every corner of the house until she finds it. He is reminding us that it is God's desire that all of us will be saved. Jesus misses us more than a

small child misses his lost toy and just as a small child finds such great comfort in that toy so we find comfort in our relationship with God.

Of course this meant we had to find lost coins around church and to make it more interesting we did it with blind folds on. We were thinking about how we lead each other to God by our actions and our prayers. Each pair had to lead a blindfolded person to the chocolate coins which were held by some of the adults because it is in our relationships that faith develops.






As we begin a new academic year, it's been a delight to welcome our new families to Samlesbury and to see how confidently our new
