

Remembrance Sunday 2025

Remembrance Sunday, commemorating the service of all those who served in the two World Wars and later conflicts is 9 November. Every year at St Michael's, the names listed in the Honour Roll are read out in the church. If you have family or friends who served in the Armed Forces, the Resistance, the Merchant Navy, or the police and rescue services during any military conflict you are welcome to add them to the Honour Roll and their name will be read out with all the others on Remembrance Sunday. On *Tuesday, 11 November* members of St Michael's congregation are asked to join the Remembrance Day march from the Gare de Beaulieu up the hill to the Monument aux Morts de 14-18, where this year's memorial service will begin promptly at 11am. Medals may be worn if you have them. An apéro provided by the Mairie will be served afterwards.

The Royal British Legion's Remembrance Appeal poppies are available in the back of the church and donations are welcomed. Funds raised by the Poppy Appeal support serving military personnel, veterans and their families, from help with the cost of living, mental wellbeing and housing, to recovery after trauma or illness, and it does that throughout the year.



From the Churchwardens

There has been progress in the **search for a new priest** for St Michael's. Three applicants were interviewed on Zoom in October. One candidate will be invited for a visit in person, in line with the Diocese's procedures. When more information on the process becomes available, it will be announced in the church after the Sunday service and published in the Messenger. In the meantime, locum priests are booked through the end of February.

On Monday, 24 November a **concert of baroque music** will be given in the church by an ensemble directed by Cédric Constantino. The program will include performances of "Three Odes to Saint Cecilia" by Henry Purcell as well as Charpentier's "Dialogue sur Sainte Cécile, martyre". The concert will begin at 8pm and the suggested entrance fee is 20 euro, payable at the door.

An early reminder that this year's *Ecumenical Advent Service* will take place in our church Wednesday, 22 December at 6pm. All members of St Michael's congregation are welcome, along with members of the Roman Catholic Church and the Danish Lutheran Church.
