
## 'Ride and Stride' - Shropshire Historic Churches Trust

## Admiral's Book Returns to Chetwynd!



A friend of Sue's who has links with the Burton Borough family recently discovered and returned this altar book to its home here at Chetwynd. The inscription inside shows that it was donated and presented by **Admiral Roberts Gawen**, to whom the stained-glass window in the south chancel is dedicated, in the year of the church's consecration in 1867.

Whilst the cover is understandably looking a little weathered, the pages on the inside are in almost pristine condition. Archdeacon Nick Watson kindly blessed the book during his visit on 14<sup>th</sup> September and used it during the service.

What a treasure to have back in our church, now sitting at the base of the window next to the memorial plaque.

Many of us have commented on how our dear Andy would have been so thrilled with this news and would have become engrossed in the historical details. We were always in such awe of his knowledge and passion for all things linked to our church's history and, in particular, our stained- glass windows.

It was with such joy, therefore, that whilst attempting to do justice to this and to give some detail and context alongside the photographs, I came across the article below. It was written by Andy himself in 2017 and is published on the website of the National Portrait Gallery:

#### **Andy Parkes**

27 January 2017, 19:29

There is a stained glass window in our Church (St Michael & All Angels, Chetwynd, Shropshire) that is dedicated to Admiral Roberts Gawen. Is was commissioned by his daughter Elizabeth Charlotte Burton Borough, as a memorial to her father: the window illustrates the presentation of our Lord at the temple.

In correspondence sent on 02/03/1876, to the window maker (John Hardman & Co of Birmingham) Elizabeth requested that the 'head, beard and features' of Simeon, should be the likeness of her late father: to achieve this she sent a photograph.

The Hardmans artist (George Bernard Maycock) clearly used the Silvy portrait - as the face in our window bears a remarkable similarity to the photo.
