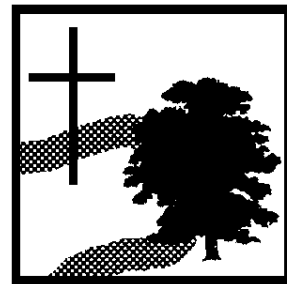

My husband and I recently attended the Waterford Harvest Supper, Murder Mystery evening. It was brilliant and was so entertaining and cleverly performed. What really stood out for me was just how much it made us laugh. It was so obvious that not only were the cast really enjoying themselves but so were the audience.



This made me realise just how rarely today we really have a proper laugh. I know that there is so much sadness and fear around us that it may seem we have nothing much to laugh about or even that we shouldn't laugh if something amuses us. However, even if life is difficult, it can make us feel so much better if we can find something to laugh or smile about. We need to get back to our inner child and laugh at silly things or things that just make us giggle.

When we share something with others, we hope that that they too will enjoy the joke but of course we can't always be sure that will be the case. Misunderstandings can and do occur and sometimes people will read quite the wrong meaning into what may just be a throw away comment. Criticism may be inferred when it isn't meant and rather than humour this can lead to upset or even a falling out.

We may feel that people are suspicious of us when all we are trying to do is help. Our sense of humour may be very different to someone else's, and we may even cause offence when none was meant. People may make fun of us in the belief that they are just being friendly when we may feel hurt. Often, we may laugh because we don't want the embarrassment of admitting that we have been made to feel uncomfortable, but that may leave us with feelings of resentment. However perhaps it is best to be honest straight away but not to retaliate in a way that makes the situation worse. Humour, again, can play a very important part in putting things right, but it's not always easy. As someone who is quite short, I am used to comments like 'stand up we can't see you' when of course I am already standing up. I am used to being small and it doesn't worry me, so I usually make a comment of my own so that people laugh with me not at me.

Wouldn't life be so much easier if we all tried to put ourselves in someone else's shoes and be empathetic to their needs and feelings. In the Bible there are several passages which try to guide us in how to behave towards each other

"Do to others as you would have them do to you." - Luke 6:31

"Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." - Colossians 3:12

And perhaps the most well known

'Love your neighbour as you love yourself.' Matthew 22:39

We can't solve all the world's problems, but we can make our own part of the world a better place by smiling at strangers, saying good morning to people we meet on the street or being patient when the person in front of us in the queue seems to be taking forever. Seeing situations from someone else's point of view can make us more tolerant of the needs of others and of course finding humour in a situation will often help. We can't be perfect and won't get it right every time, but we can try to pass kindness around. If we brighten someone's day it makes us feel better but also makes them more likely to pass that kindness on to someone else. Just like a stone making ripples in the water so our kind acts can spread far and wide and make life better for all whose lives are touched by the unselfish love of others.

WATERFORD

ST MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS WATERFORD

It has been quite a busy Autumn so far.

Dorothy Abel Smith gave a Talk on September 20th "Sir Edward Burne-Jones Bt 1833-1898- his life and works" She described his early life in Birmingham and meeting William Morris at Oxford. They formed a lifelong working relationship and between them created many of the greatest 19th century works of art. Burne-Jones travelled in Europe and was inspired by the earlier works of Botticelli, Raphael, Michaelangelo and ancient Greek art.

During his life he produced dozens of paintings, designed tapestries, stained glass, jewellery, embroidery and engravings which can be seen in galleries and museums around the world. Churches in England have windows by Burne-Jones and manufactured in the Morris workshops.

St Michael and All Angels, Waterford was built by order of Robert Smith in 1872, Morris and Co were commissioned to design the windows and interior decorations. Burne-Jones designed five of the original windows- The east end window, Michael the Archangel on the north chancel. King David and Miriam the Prophetess on the south chancel. St. John on the west end. Later he designed the triptych window for Robert Smith in 1894 and for the Mrs Robert Smith.

At the end of his life he was created Sir Edward Burne-Jones. Baronet. His Memorial Service was the first ever held at Westminster Abbey.

Dorothy also described the recent restoration of the Reredos, designed by James Powell in 1872; and the importance of funding this complex work.

70 people attended the Talk, then tea was served in the Village Hall. Over £450.00 was raised.

A huge thank you to Dorothy for sharing her time and knowledge and helping us raise much needed funds. Thanks also to the generosity of those that attended.

The following weekend Waterford church held its annual **Harvest Supper**. Fish and chips followed by apple crumble was enjoyed by those that attended. A little light entertainment was also provided in the form of a Murder Mystery set in Hollywood. The costumes, accents and story line provided great amusement and intrigue and a good time was had by all. Great thanks to all who contributed.

On Saturday 4th October a small team of workers attacked some of the bigger jobs in the churchyard. It was a windy day but the rain held off and the churchyard was noticeably tidier. Great thanks to those who took part. Please note that this is going to be a regular event at 10am on the first Saturday of April and the first Saturday in October each year.

Of course thoughts are now turning to Christmas so I've included a date for your diary. Our annual **Carol Service** will take place on 21st December at 6pm and all are welcome. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 9th NOVEMBER

Waterford Nature Notes

I heard on the wireless a report about research into the DNA of Peacock spiders. There are over 100 species of Peacock spiders, all of which have different markings and tiny differences in behaviour, habitat, etc. The males perform a dance to attract females to mate, the dances are one of the tiny variations. The research will look at the differences in DNA to try to identify which strands of DNA cause what effects. The ultimate aim is to use the findings to decipher the 'codes' contained in DNA so that we will have a complete understanding of the DNA of every living thing.

Have you ever thought about how grasses recover? During the long, dry spell of this Summer we decided to not waste water by watering the lawn and the pot plants but to just let them take their chance. The lawn became a dry, brittle, brown and apparently dead all over except for a narrow strip that was sheltered from the sun by the shadow of our hedge. The morning dew didn't dry off and this proved enough moisture to keep that grass alive and green, even to need cutting. After weeks of the lawn being 'dead' the rains came, within a few days of the first rain, new shoots were growing and, with further rain, the whole lawn recovered. Unfortunately, most of the pot plants did die.



It might have been that the lawn was so sere that the grasshoppers were more evident or it might have been that this was a 'good' year for them but we saw many in our garden including a couple of species not seen here before. Grasshoppers are one of those insects that live for only a year, there are some that hibernate but not in Britain. Eggs are laid in late Summer, in the soil, survive the winter and hatch in Spring. The nymphs metamorphose several times before reaching maturity, they then mate and the cycle begins again.

Ladybirds do hibernate and often find their way into houses where clusters might be found in a favoured spot. Many ladybirds hibernate in the church but they haven't picked a good place, many hundreds die each year.

In my notes in the August edition of the Parish News, I reported on the illegal killing of birds of prey, we had a short break in the Scottish Borders, just South of Lanark. The local news reported on a pair of Golden Eagles that had been fitted with trackers. After what was described as 'suspicious activity' the trackers went off air. A search of the area with specialist dogs found no trace of either the birds or the trackers so this was clearly another illegal killing with the trackers being destroyed or buried.

While in Scotland we visited a remote, ruined hunting lodge, Morton Castle. The ruin is perched on a hill above a small, artificial loch. The loch was inhabited by a pair of Mute Swans with three young, a pair of Canada geese also with several young and a few Mallard, Wigeon and Coot. I have reported before, as has my Southgate Correspondent, on the enmity between breeding Swans and Canada geese, these were living in perfect harmony with the adult geese only a few metres away from the cygnets and one of the goslings quite close to the adult swans.

This is a good time for a Human Nature Note. The road to the loch was narrow with very few passing places, meeting another vehicle would have meant one of us being aware of the last possible passing place and reversing. The farther along the road we went the worse became the surface. 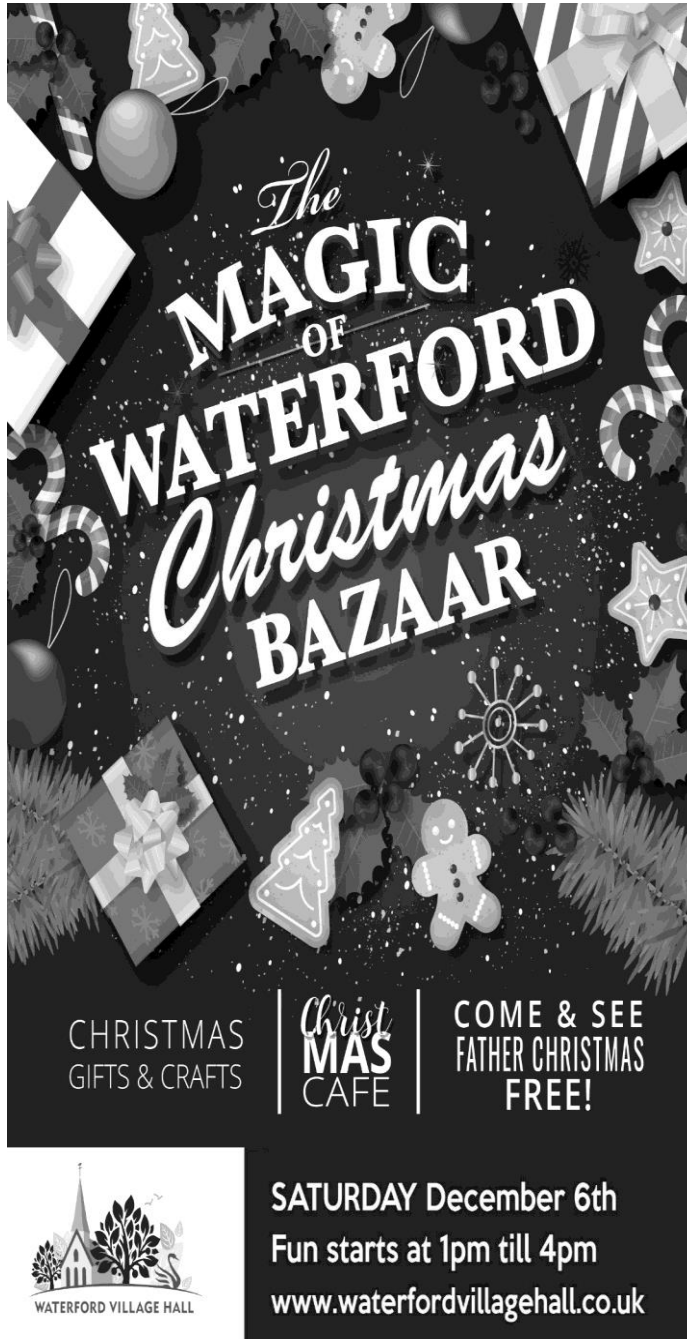
