8.30am BCP Holy Communion is from the Book of Common Prayer – a quiet, traditional communion service.

10am Holy Communion is a service using liturgy from Common Worship with hymns and music, and with Junior Church on 2nd and 4th Sundays.

10am All Age Communion is a more contemporary communion service specifically for 'all ages'. There is no Junior Church on this Sunday as the children stay for the service.

10am Third Sunday Experience and Explore is an informal service without communion; it includes a talk, a time for personal reflection, activities for all ages and refreshments.

Royal British Legion

It was pleasing that a group of us, including the widow of a Chindit, were able to remember the fallen in the Far East at our War Memorial on VJ Day 80, Friday 15 August. The considerable national and local press coverage of VJ 80 made numerous references to World War II in South East Asia and the Far East, and I have a sincere hope that the term 'Forgotten Army' may no longer need to be applied to the XIV Army, fighting in Assam and Burma after VE Day in 1945.

Looking ahead, the two-week 2025 Poppy Appeal will start on 25 October and I am amazed at the support I have already had to help run the table in our Waitrose store through the 15 days of the appeal.



It is not too late to offer to help. Please make any donation you feel able to contribute, and wear your poppy with pride: I try and wear mine all year.

This year Remembrance Day is Sunday 9 November and we will assemble at the War Memorial at 10.50am to remember the fallen of the two World Wars and conflicts since. Do go along to the church afterwards for coffee.

Despite being no longer able to stop the traffic, the short ceremony and wreath-laying takes place in an orderly calm manner as befits the occasion. An increasing number of villagers attend and this alone demonstrates the understanding people have of the sacrifices made by the fallen that we might enjoy the peace we do. We just pray that the armed conflicts taking place around the globe can all move to an honourable and lasting peace.



Trumpington Community Orchard

It has been a strange summer at the Community Orchard, reflecting the various changes in the weather. The early summer rainfall resulted in many of the apple trees fruiting well despite the infestation of apple ermine moth caterpillars. However, the following long spell of dry sunny weather led to the ripening of the apples while still relatively small as it was impractical to keep watering the trees. There is a now a good harvest of small apples for the local community to enjoy. The fruit on the quince tree seems to have escaped a similar fate and the welcome return of the rain should see an abundance of good fruit.



Despite the dry weather, the meadow continues to provide a habitat for a number of insect species including butterflies (such as the common blue), dragonflies, damselflies and moths. We have managed to take photographs of some of these, including some of the rarer species of moth and these can be seen on the Orchard website. In future years we hope to document more of these sightings as there is now a significant interest in recording insect species in Cambridge with an increasing number of natural wildlife areas in the region. The observational beehive remains very active and we wait to see how it fares this winter and if an opportunity arises to replace some of the comb supports. The wildlife habitat continues to be occupied by sparrows and robins, with the abundance of insects on the fruit trees providing a good food source in the long spell of dry weather. The nesting swifts and their new offspring departed for southern territories in August and we were lucky to have eight pairs this year who we hope will return next spring. While the Orchard remains a popular green space with much of the local community, we have unfortunately still been having problems with some antisocial behaviour and vandalism of the picnic benches. However, we continue trying to teach our youth to respect the environment and understand that it is they themselves who lose out by damaging the Orchard as it provides one of the few peaceful, safe places in the area that they can meet with their friends.

A more recent problem has been the use of the Orchard by a few dog owners, despite the clear 'no dogs' notice on the gate, who have their dogs off their leads in the orchard. We continue to try to explain that the purpose of the Orchard is to provide a natural green wildlife habitat, as well as a safe, peaceful area for everyone, including mothers and toddlers. We hope that some recent conversations about a local dog run in Trumpington may provide an alternative, that will also avoid problems such as chewing of the Orchard picnic benches by young puppies.

We hope that all users of the Community Orchard realise that it is maintained by kind volunteers and persistent problems are rather demoralising for people who give their free time, so the local community can continue to enjoy this much-needed green space. Our next maintenance session is on Sunday 14 December; as always dress in suitable clothing and footwear and we will provide gloves and tools. Hope to see you soon!


