

Dear Friends

By the time you read this the clocks will have been put back and the evenings will be closing in, as if the year, in nature at least, is closing down for a rest. Which in a way it is. The Church's year is also approaching its end, though a little earlier than what we normally take to be the end of the year, December 31st.

In the Church November opens with the last principal feast of the liturgical year, All Saints' Day (which is preceded by All Hallows'

Eve, October 31st, which has become more familiarly known as 'Halloween'), and the liturgical year closes with the day before the fourth Sunday before Advent, and after which you can begin opening your advent calendars! Coincidentally this year this Sunday, marking the move into the new liturgical year, falls on the

last day of November, November the 30th. In the Church the period between these two dates is a period of reflection on the reign of Christ in earth and heaven.

Now all this must seem a long way removed from our usual concerns at this time; and in a way it is. Christmas started a long time ago as far as shops and online advertising are concerned; the competition for one's custom, the pressure to enjoy the Christmas period is already building up. As well as this, this particular year may well be harder financially for many with the prospect of still rising costs and little relief in sight. A budget in late November may well add to the collective gloom. It seems as if at this time of the year time speeds up rather than winds down, propelling us forward under all sorts of pressures.

So there is a contrast here; if ordinary life can be a bit hectic, for the Church it is a quieter time. This I think can be a positive for all of us. Our faith enables us to take a step back, to find some quiet time, if only for a few moments, in the midst of all the busyness. The causes of pressures that might appear overwhelming will not necessarily go away but the 'felt' pressures themselves can be reduced by re-framing our perspective on things; living in the life of Christ, offering Him attention, opens us to receiving that gift of peace 'that passes all human understanding'.

So we live in two different times, in two different realities and each requires our attention. Worth perhaps reflecting on as we approach the end of the year (in both senses). Vaughan Kerry (reader).

Awe, light and cheer at Festival of Wonder 2025

Anticipation is building for Stroud's annual Festival of Wonder, held in St Laurence Church: a celebration designed to help recapture a sense of awe and wonder of God's creation, bringing light, cheer and wonder to the darkness of winter.

Now in its fourth year, the festival will run from 21 to 23 November, bringing together both professional and amateur performances of music, drama, comedy, and circus. There will also be workshops, children's activities, a creche, a reflective space, the famous Wall of Wonder, food, warmth, and community.

Almost all the events are free and suitable for all ages.

Bryan Court, chair of the Festival of Wonder operations team, said: "The festival is a gift to our community and the ethos behind it is to encourage a re-imagining of what Church could be like, and certainly how the church building might be used to the benefit the whole community. Unfortunately, a lot of people consider church buildings as dark and unfriendly spaces – somewhere you go for funerals or weddings, and often where fundraising is a predominant feature. Our hope is the festival will challenge some of these misconceptions and may just spark in some people the beginning of a journey of faith."

One of the highlights is a trapeze performance inside the church. "It really does encourage people to view the church in a fresh way," Bryan said.

This year's storyline is based on the parable of the Pearl of Great Price, symbolising the pricelessness of the Kingdom of Heaven. Inclusivity is a key aspect of the festival, with two free Relaxed Performances for people with additional needs.

"For these two shows, the circus performance is adjusted in a way that makes it accessible to those whose needs are special, whether it be a physical disability or a neurodiverse factor where sometimes just the sheer excitement of being in a crowded place can be overwhelming," Bryan said. Throughout the weekend there will be chaplains and a quiet space for reflection so that people can make sense of all that they have seen and experienced. The festival partners with the Diocese of Gloucester, receiving support through the LIFE Together Fund and other donors.

Kathryn Warner, Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Officer, said: "Festival of Wonder is very grateful for the funding they've received from the Diocesan LIFE Together Fund to both invest in delivering this year's event, and in developing opportunities to grow and develop over the coming years, in partnership with colleagues across the diocese. They have also received funding from Sylvanus Lysons towards this year's event."

Historic chapel revived as 'The Shepherd's Hut' in Little Sodbury

An abandoned chapel in Little Sodbury has been restored and reopened as 'The Shepherd's Hut', offering traditional Book of Common Prayer (BCP) Holy Communion services and new outreach initiatives.

The once-derelict chapel has been transformed with comfortable seating, a kitchenette, and donated furnishings, including a locally painted image of *The Shepherd* symbolising its renewed purpose. During restoration, the Revd Thomas Powe discovered 19th-century chapel minutes which expressed hope that the building would be used in future to "forward the Gospel of Christ." He said, "It's extraordinary that it became a church, ceased to be one, and has now returned to Christian ministry."

Led by father and son team, David and Thomas Powe, the project aims to help people explore faith through traditional worship. Regular BCP services will take place at 10am on Friday 14 November and 12 December.




