#### **Thought for Thursday**

Pumpkins are appearing on doorsteps, shops are full of sweets, and the nation's supply of fake cobwebs has been mysteriously depleted once again... It must be nearly Halloween.

Christians have had a rather complicated relationship with Halloween over the years. On the one hand, it's hard not to smile at little witches and wizards knocking on doors and politely demanding chocolate. On the other hand, the church has often worried about the darker side of the celebration.

But here's the thing: the word "Halloween" itself comes from *All Hallows' Eve* – the night before *All Saints' Day*. It's meant to be a time when we remember that, even though death and darkness exist, they don't get the last word. The light of Christ shines brighter.

So, perhaps instead of being spooked by Halloween, we can chuckle at it. After all, the devil must be having a bad week if the scariest thing he can throw at us is a child in a polyester Dracula cape asking for Haribo.

This year, as you carve your pumpkin, maybe place a candle inside and let it shine. It's a reminder that we are called to be "lights in the world" (Philippians 2:15) – even if our lights happen to be orange, hollow, and slightly singed around the edges.
