Ghosties & Ghoulies & Things that go Bump in the Night

By the time you are reading this you may already be heartily fed-up with the fizz and bang of fireworks, gaggles of children in fancy dress who have over-dosed on sucrose, and wondering what winter festival is being celebrated so enthusiastically tonight that it borders on a disturbance of the peace!



Wasn't it so much easier when we were younger? Penny for the Guy, apple bobbing, a packet of sparklers, a bonfire in the back garden and a small box of Wessex fireworks.

Why is it that this time of the year as the night draws in (and we should be settling in to early nights in front of the telly and mugs of cocoa) that we seem ever more determined to try to dispel the darkness of the night? As with many of our customs and traditions (particularly in the winter months) we light fires and make noise to chase the darkness away and protect our home from its shadow. Our folklore and fear of the dark is even used in epics such as *The Lord of the Rings* and, my favourite fantasy movie, *The Neverending Story*.

The roots of Hallowe'en, or more fully *All Hallow's Eve*, come from our desire to conquer darkness. Mrs Vicar will not be pleased if she finds me scoffing all the leftovers.

ADVENT APPEAL FOR LIVING GENEROUSLY

The Parish Share is the life blood of the Diocese

Over the last few weeks we have been following a series of talks called Living Generously centred around John 12 v. 1-3, where Mary anoints Jesus with a precious oil of spikenard: and the perfume filled the whole house.



Generosity cannot be contained:

it spills out to bless others and becomes a facet of eternal life: 'Truly I tell you, 'says Jesus, 'wherever the gospel is preached throughout the world, what she has done will also be told, in memory of her.' (Mark 14 v. 9)

This year our focus is based on fulfilling our commitment to the Parish Share which is our contribution to the work of the whole diocese:

Besides paying for the costs of housing and providing a Stipend for our Vicar and training our Assistant Clergy and Readers, the Share covers the total cost of ministry across the Diocese, Safeguarding provision and training, Study Days and ongoing ministerial development, advice and support on our buildings, (particularly when a faculty is needed), technical support for contactless giving, training and support for children, families and youth work and access to legal advice.

The Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich has 443 parishes organized into 106 benefices and 16 deaneries. There are 481 church buildings of which 457 are listed. There are approximately 119 stipendiary (paid) clergy and literally dozens and dozens of self-supporting ministers both lay and ordained: Readers, Evangelists,

Children and Family workers, Pioneer Ministers and over 350 lay assistants (Lay Elders).

The Parish Share is the life blood of the Diocese and all that is involved in the administration of these immense responsibilities. I attended Diocesan Synod on Saturday 18 October and was really struck by what a hard and often thankless task this is. Although the numbers of those employed at Churchgates House have grown, most posts are part-time, some are funded by external grants or other provision, and nearly all are struggling with the work load.

None of this makes for good headlines or easy fund-raising but it is the foundation of mission and ministry, so please pray for those involved in this far less visible side of church life.

This year we have a shortfall of approximately £29 000 and any donation, large or small is welcome:

Donations can be made in any form: Cash, cheque, bank transfer, or direct debit via the Parish Giving Scheme. (The PGS is launching a new website on 3 November when new donations may be made)

Please put cash donations in an envelope marked 'Parish Share' and place in the collection plate during any of the services Cheques should be made payable to 'Kesgrave PCC'.

BACS transfers go to Kesgrave Parish Parochial Council: ask Emma or Sally for Account and Sort Code details.

global justice, and encouraging ethical choices that care for both people and the planet.

The Fair Trade Shop was formed 36 years ago by

a group of Traidcraft representatives whose aim was to introduce food, beverages and craft items produced by people who were not exploited but received fair pay for their work and enough to support their communities and provide education. For those who continued, formed a company and opened a shop, this is still our passion and, although there have been many changes since those early days – not least the closure of Traidcraft – we continue to sell a huge range of products on this basis.

Sustainability is very important and many craft items are made from recycled materials; growing tea, coffee and cocoa in this changing climate means that planting of trees and diversification is the only way they can continue to make a living and this can be achieved through the fairtrade premium.

We are stocking up for Christmas; please consider us when buying Christmas cards (supporting the work of Transform Trade, Amnesty International, the Soil Association and Somersham Ward, Ipswich Hospital), Advent Calendars from the Meaningful Chocolate Company and Divine Chocolate and other seasonal goodies.
