

### **Public Toilets**

These sessions are open to all, though we ask that children are accompanied by an adult, and they are a great way to hour or spend an two doing something practical for community. The next litter pick will take place on Sunday 19th October at 10am, meeting in the Market Refreshments will Square. provided afterwards, and everyone is very welcome.

### **Fundraising Success**

A big thank you goes to Cllr Kevin Teasdale, who recently raised over £2,000 through a very special evening performance. Taking to the stage as Henry VIII, Cllr Teasdale gave a lively dinner performance recounting the king's life and history. The event was well attended, and we are most grateful to everyone who bought tickets and supported the evening. The money raised will go directly back into the community, helping to replace the broken seesaw at Comb Hill Park and funding other repairs to play equipment there.

### Wildflower Trial

You may also have noticed new signs in the Pig Market area (the hill Sainsbury's). behind The Town Council is trialling а new management approach here. allowing wildflowers to grow naturally with just two cuts a year, in spring and autumn. This simple supports biodiversity by providing food and habitat for bees, butterflies and other pollinators, which are vital to а healthy environment. Wildflower areas not only bring colour and variety to the town but also play an important role in sustaining local ecosystems. We hope residents will enjoy seeing this space develop through the seasons.





# Holy Cross, Haltwhistle

We begin this month with a Harvest Festival service at 10am on the 5th October – You are warmly invited to come and give thanks to God for all the blessings we have, giving thanks particularly for the food we have and for all our farmers and their work.

We have a lot to give thanks for and despite some doom and gloom, there's a lot of good going on. Did you know that the World Food Programme reports that national school meal programmes now serve 466 million children worldwide, up 80 million since 2020 with Africa leading the surge. Low-income countries expanded access by 60%, and now, 99% of funding is coming from national budgets. The rate of maternal mortality for live births fell by 57% between 1985 and 2023, resulting in around 365,000 fewer maternal deaths each year. And the World Bank reports that nearly 100 million fewer children live in extreme poverty than a decade ago, from 507 million in 2014 to 412 million in 2024, despite population growth setbacks from COVID-19. And the UN thinks that population growth, that was expected to reach a peak in 2085 may reach its peak in the 2050s.

And locally, we give thanks to God for the blessings we have here, including our own retired Rev Keith who did his best Henry VIII impression for the Comb Hill playground, for our church wardens and committee members who keep all our beautiful churches safe, maintained. and visitable, and for all who help our Christian fellowship. If you get the magazine to come too late for the Harvest service, well, you could always come on regular Sunday, or perhaps for our All Saint's/All Souls services on the November - Henshaw 10am 2nd Haltwhistle 4pm. All welcome.

# St Cuthberts, Greenhead

St Cuthbert's Church Greenhead is a small community and because of that there are some church festivals that we don't do in our church but rather we join with Holy Cross, Haltwhistle. One of those festivals is the celebration of All Souls Day when we have a service to remember those known to us who have died. All those we have done funerals for since last year we will remember in the prayers, and it can be a moving and peace giving time for those who have had funerals to attend in the last year or so.

It is possible to add names of those known to you to be remembered in the prayers by telling the welcomers as you arrive who you would like mentioned. This year's service will be at Holy Cross Church on Sunday 2nd November at 4pm, but if that time is difficult we have a similar service at Henshaw on 2nd November at 10am - that Sunday all our churches will join together in Henshaw for the morning service. We have a joint service together on the first Sunday of every month and sometimes they come to us and sometimes we go to them, and it reminds us that the Christian fellowship is bigger than those connected to our own St Cuthbert's Church.



Of course for All Souls Day we remember that the Christian fellowship is even bigger than those who happen still to be alive today we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses, myriads of angels and all the heavenly host and on All Saints Day and All Souls Day we remember how we are part of one great communion and fellowship, all of us alive in presence of God. Come and be part of it  $\circ$ . Each Sunday here at 11am, but 2nd November will be 10am Henshaw, 4pm Haltwhistle.

# All Hallows, Henshaw

As our churches get ready for the Harvest Festival services, you may be reminded of well known hymns like We plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the ground, but it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand. The words were originally written by a German poet, Matthias Claudius in the 18th Century and later translated into English. We now sing it to a well known tune, probably first taught to us in school.

Singing well known hymns is one of the great pleasures of being in church, and we are fortunate on many Sundays to enjoy accompanied by our regular organist on our fantastic modern organ in Henshaw. When he is not able to play for us, we can programme our modern digital hymnal, an amazing player that has more than 3000 When hymn tunes on it. programming it for a service, it is possible to experiment with different styles of organ - you can even play the hymns as if we were in a great Cathedral.

However flexible the digital player might be, nothing beats "the real thing". Our modern organ Henshaw was a gift from a former organist, and using its various stops, so many different sounds and effects are possible. We are sometimes treated to a fanfare, or the pealing of bells, and we always enjoy a "mini recital" before and after the service. If you are a music lover, or someone who likes to sing, why not join us for our Harvest Service on Sunday 28 September at 11 am at All Hallows', Henshaw, or on Sunday 5th October at Holy Cross Haltwhistle at 10 am. The school harvests both here and in Greenhead are later this month and families connected with the school will have the date. But every Sunday, come and sing! It's good for your health and so you'll enjoy even more Harvests as a result!

In the centre of town, Haltwhistle part of the Library thrives as Haltwhistle Hub—a welcoming space designed to bring people together. More than just a place for books, the library and hub provide a warm, inclusive environment for meeting, learning, and community connection.

### A Space for Everyone

Haltwhistle Hub is built around the idea of creating opportunities:

- · A place to meet others
- A venue to take part in activities
- A community hub where you can visit the library

The hub runs a regular programme of events covering health, wellbeing, skills development, and employment advice. 

### The ghost of Featherstone Castle

Featherstone Castle is on the bank of the South Tyne, 3 miles from Haltwhistle. The woods are thought to be haunted by a ghostly cavalcade of knights and ladies and local people report of their dogs and horses being "spooked" in the area.

Hundreds of years ago the Baron of Featherstone had a beautiful daughter, Abigail, whom he adored. The Baron had selected a nobleman of fortune for her husband, but Abigail loved elsewhere - one of the Ridley clan. This was a forbidden love due to an ancient feud between the families.





Despite her protests, the marriage took place and afterwards the bridal party set out to 'ride the bounds' - a traditional procession around the estate boundary. After which there was to be a banquet in celebration.. Abigail's lover, with his friends, hid in the woods and planned to ambush the procession and rescue Abigail.

Back at the castle all was prepared for the banquet, the servants, minstrels and the Baron waited to greet the returning procession. Time passed, it grew dark and the Baron became anxious. He sent out a search party but there was no trace.

# Celebrating 50 Years of Haltwhistle's Outdoor Pool

It's no easy task to sum up the history of our outdoor pool in a single article, but here goes.

At the end of June 1975, two unrelated factors came together to create what is now Haltwhistle's beloved open-air swimming pool. First, there was the urgent need for a safe place to swim. Secondly, local rivers were the go-to spot during the summer months but after two tragic drowning incidents in the early 1970s, civic leaders began looking for a purpose-built facility that could offer safety as well as fun.





Around the same time, changes in the economic climate meant the Miners' Welfare building and bowling green at Greencroft were no longer needed for their original purpose, so the trustees donated the land for a new swimming pool and local people contributed to the build of the pool And so, in 1975, our pool opened its gates.



Over the last 50 years, the site has continued to evolve, with new buildings and features added to meet the needs of our growing community. In 2003, the centre as we know it today was officially opened, bringing modern facilities to this cherished local landmark.

Since then, tens of thousands of people locals and visitors alike have come through our gates. If you meet someone from Haltwhistle, chances are they learned to swim right here in our outdoor pool.

This past season has been another busy and successful one. We've welcomed swimmers of all ages, offering a full programme of school and private lessons with the same goal we started with back in 1975: to teach vital water safety and swimming skills to everyone.

We've also added some exciting new sessions to the calendar, including Sound Bath (floating meditation), Sunrise Swims, and even Midnight Swims. These unique experiences have been a big hit, and we can't wait to bring them back for the 2026 season.



A special highlight this year was the of **SEND** return our (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) swimming sessions, made possible through generous funding from our local community These shop. sessions are held during quieter times and include extra staffing to individual needs. The support response has been incredibly positive, and we're deeply grateful to the community shop for making such a valuable programme possible.



We're proud of everything we've achieved this year and none of it would be possible without you. To our loyal leisure card holders, members, volunteers, and regular users: thank you. Your continued support and enthusiasm help us grow and keep the pool running strong for everyone to enjoy.

We're already looking ahead to next year and can't wait to welcome you back for another season of swimming in 2026.
