

Pastoral
Letter
Daniel writes





Dear Friends,

As the long days of summer gently slip into the golden glow of autumn, and rain continues to pour, our parish is once again wrapped in the beauty of the harvest season. The lanes around us tell their own story, of hedgerows heavy with berries, and orchards with fruit that almost seems to shine in the softer sunlight. It is a time of year that encourages us to stop for a moment, to breathe, and to take notice.

Harvest has always been more than simply the gathering of crops. It is, at its heart, an invitation to gratitude. In a world where it is so easy to rush from one thing to the next, we can forget to pause and appreciate what we have. Yet the sight of stacked hay bales and buckets of apples, reminds us that much of what we depend on has been quietly growing for months, tended by hands that rise early, work hard, and care deeply about what they produce. When we sit down to eat, we are sharing in the fruits of many people's labours, farmers, drivers, shop workers, and so many others. To notice this and to give thanks, even in the simplest way, can bring a sense of grounding and perspective amongst the rush of our daily lives. Harvest is also about sharing. Traditionally, this was the time when communities came together not only to

celebrate but to look after one another. In centuries past, people brought what they had, grain, vegetables, eggs or fruit to make sure that everyone could enjoy the season's bounty. The custom of the harvest festival grew out of that generous instinct, and we will celebrate our own harvest festivals in each of our churches on the 5<sup>th</sup> of October. Continuing this long tradition of generosity, care and love for those in need. All of our food donations from these services go to our local food banks; Greenway Gifts and the Family Haven. We distribute food to anyone who feels that they have a need.

And finally harvest reminds us that we are part of something bigger than ourselves. The steady turning of the seasons can be a gentle teacher: what is planted and nurtured will, in time, bear fruit. This is true in the fields, but also in our lives. The kindness we offer, the time we give, the care we show, these are like seeds that grow into something good, often in ways we do not see straight away.

So as autumn settles in, I encourage you to celebrate this harvest season in whatever way feels right for you: take a walk and notice the colours, the falling conkers and the changing light; enjoy the taste of something freshly baked or picked; share what you can with someone who might need it. Above all, take a moment to be thankful, not just for food, but for friendship, for community, and for the simple beauty of this time of year.

#### **Meeting Jesus online**

For many people, gaming is a space for competition, creativity, and connection. For the Revd Jay Niblett, Rector of Rivervale Churches, he also sees gaming as a platform to explore faith and meet Jesus.

Jay runs a gaming portal, Eden Forge, with business partner Josiah Holloway. Eden Forge offers individually crafted Sunday School sessions for children aged 7-12, which are run virtually and in person at local churches. It provides a Minecraft Online Club open to young people across the world, and it also offers teaching for young people and their parents or guardians as they start to learn the basics of Minecraft.

Jay said: "Gaming is a powerful platform for building relationships and discussion. For children, particularly children who maybe aren't connected to churches or places where it's a bit more rural, they can connect with other young people in the online world and use Minecraft to learn about the Bible and faith."

In the summer, Jay ran a free, two-day holiday gaming club in Meon Vale, introducing children and young people to popular games like FIFA and Mario Kart.

They also entered a custom-built Minecraft world, where meeting Jesus was key to the success of the mission.

Jay said: "They entered the cave as a team, encountering dangerous creatures and obstacles. The world was designed to be challenging, so teamwork was essential. Then Jesus arrived in the game, who intervened to help them succeed. It illustrated the idea that God gives us what we need when we need it in life."

Eden Forge was born out of lockdown, when Jay began exploring how games could support safe conversations. During this time, he encountered Land of Promise, a Singapore-based initiative creating biblical storylines within Minecraft. After testing one of their virtual worlds with his own children – walking through a desert while experiencing the story of Moses – Jay recognised the potential of gaming to provide new opportunities for exploring faith.

"You could use Eden Forge to go through a six or seven-week course, but through gaming," Jay said. "The average age for a gamer is 30 years old – many adults are gaming, why not meet them there? It seems like now's the time to find any angle where we can connect and see people and become the Church of the future for the next generation. Gaming can help do that."

Longer term, Jay's vision is to start regular online gatherings for young people, and occasional events for adults. These would encourage discipleship and fellowship and eventually would evolve into structured resources for churches to run short faith courses within a game.

Bishop Rachel said: "If we want a relationship with someone to deepen and grow, we need to spend time with that person. It can be no surprise that the same is true between us and God." ## The Urgency of Snails


