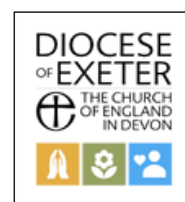

Welcome to the 31st edition of the Hub Post

November is the month for remembering. At the very beginning of the month, we have All Saints and All Souls, followed by Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day.

In the very act of remembering we recall someone or an event... we draw on the memories which we have, and we make those memories present to us. As human beings, remembering with our minds can also evoke feelings in our hearts too. Remembering can be an emotional journey, and it can be healing too.

When we remember we recall someone or something; we draw on our memories. But, of course, because we are human beings, what we remember with our minds evokes feelings in our hearts and in our bodies. Our memories may make us feel warm and comforted – they may fill us with joy, or they may fill us with sadness, sorrow, and regret – they may make us feel low.

Zakar is a Hebrew word from the Old Testament meaning to remember, recall, or call to mind, but when God remembers his people, he also does something for them, such as bringing them out of exile. When God remembers us, he does something for us as well. When Jesus took bread and wine – simple ingredients on the Passover table and commanded us to do this *in remembrance of me*, there was something of his own hope that he would be remembered and his mission passed on. There was too, a desire to give his disciples some way of keeping his memory alive, in a tangible way, when he was gone.

November is a month in which the days continue to shorten, and it is not coincidence perhaps that as the days shorten, human beings have found symbols of light to remind them of the hope that lies beneath our cold and bleak winter world. We find it echoed in the psalms: *'My soul waits for the Lord like a watchman for daybreak.'*

Some churches have All Souls services, and these provide opportunities for us to remember those who have been important to us. By remembering we keep their memories alive and by bringing them to mind we too can somehow keep their presence in our lives.

Often, we light candles as a sign of remembering and, like the remembrance of God, we do something too. As we light the candle we say a prayer for that person. The candlelight reminds us that we too can share the light of hope that we carry with others. When you are in a dark place, the warmth of a smile or a kind word can mean a lot.

It may feel that the light we offer to others is small and insignificant in times of darkness, but each time it is shared it is not halved but doubled. Together we really can make a difference to each other.

Remembering is important and it is important that we are gentle with ourselves and give ourselves time and space in which to do our remembering.

for all people of the land.

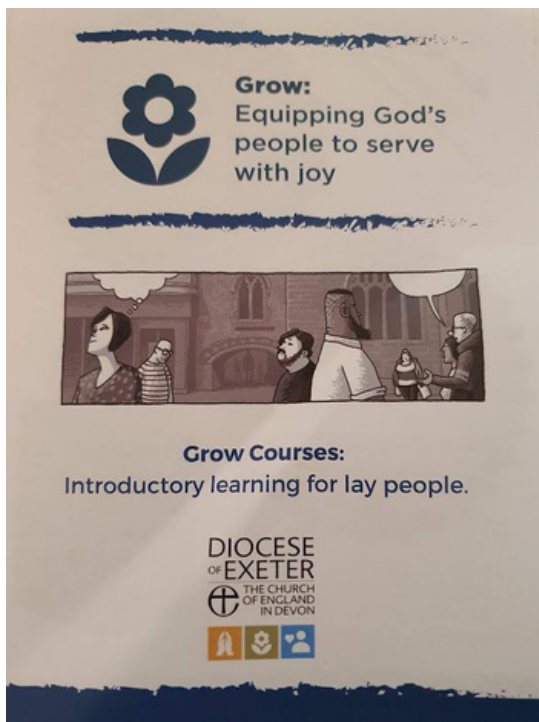
While we pray to you, O Lord, for an end to violence and the

GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

- Time commitment – 10 hours per calendar month largely in the week leading up to the last Monday of the month when the magazine goes to the printers
- Computer literate – the parish magazine is currently produced in MS Publisher but other software packages can be used
- An eye for detail and layout
- Liaison with contributors
- Liaison with the printers – Hedgerow Print
- Liaison with advertisers
- Emailing the magazine to the email subscribers each month
- Editorial support available if needed

The parish magazine editor also undertakes the annual renewal of advertising in the parish magazine. There is a one-off payment of £100 for this activity.

Sandford Harvest

My childhood memories of harvest in the next village are a bit of a muddy blur.

Carefully painting harvest pictures at school desks on raggedy-cut kitchen paper for the competitive displays in a tent at the Ploughing Match. We had a day off school for the Ploughing Match which was a really big event, like a combination of Sandford's Flower & Produce Show with additional farmer's entries of best hay or corn etc and, for me the most exciting bit, clay pigeon shooting!

Then there was bringing garden produce for the Harvest Festival – shiny apples, odd shaped carrots, whatever was in people's gardens. I never thought of where it all went afterwards. And singing harvest songs for which we had had to miss playtime to practise in the school hall.

The years roll by and times change but autumn always comes, so harvest is still celebrated in the countryside.

In Sandford this year there was the annual Parish Harvest Supper, a grand occasion put together by a team who bring salads and delicious desserts, cook and carve hams, bake local jacket potatoes and cut up quiches. Tables are set up in the hall, a raffle is organised and a bounty stall with produce, preserves and plants is available. The memorable entertainment was provided by the Chudleigh Shantymen and the magnificent sum of £1101.02 was raised for the Church Path Fund.

Sandford School came to St Swithun's for their Harvest Festival and a big congregation of children and parents heard about their work from a member of Crediton Food Bank, before they brought their own Food Bank donations forward.

St Swithun's held their own Harvest service a few days later, taken this year by the Archdeacon of Exeter. The porch, window sills and flower stands were beautifully arranged with produce and flower arrangements giving the church a distinctive autumn fragrance and an explosion of bright colours. Both groceries and monies (£150.50) were donated and delivered to the Food Bank.

Finally Beacon Church at New Buildings had its own distinctive Harvest Celebration. A service, with singing that would equal a Welsh choir, was led by Crediton rector Matthew Tregenza in the beautifully decorated old schoolroom. This was followed by the auction of produce for charity. The auctioneer, John Saunders, was eloquent and humorous ('What will you give me for this fine swede anyone? Two pounds?') and £441 was raised, split between FORCE and MND.

According to the last census, only about 17% of the population of England is rural, which means the vast majority of English people are quite disconnected from food growing and production – and harvest! How extraordinarily lucky we are to live in the parish of Sandford.

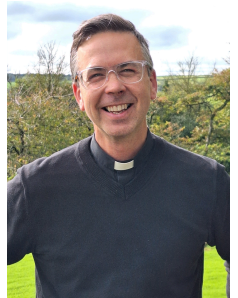
