#### THE RECTOR'S LETTER:

#### Dear Friends,

There are moments in all our lives when something so significant happens we remember exactly when and where we were, and what we were doing. The older children in our community will probably tell stories to their children about what life was like during a global pandemic. Most days we probably no longer think about it, but it was a significant and difficult time for us all. There have been others, but the terrorist attacks in the USA that we all now know as 9/11 is perhaps the other most significant event that I can clearly remember so far this century. It seems almost impossible to think that it happened Twenty-Four years ago this month. At that time, I was working as a Senior Auditor for HSBC and I was in London conducting an audit. Like all these things I remember who I was with, where I was and exactly how I watched the events unfold on TV. There was a moment when I almost thought I was watching a prank, some kind of disaster movie rather than the news. But it was something that changed things whether we realised that or not. Four years later I visited ground zero, the site of the Twin towers in New York. Surrounded by fencing I was aware that as people approached to see, and to remember those who lost their lives, it was incredibly quiet. And in the middle of the site stood what became known as the ground zero cross, formed from beams found among the debris. This became for many in New York a symbol of hope, faith, and indeed healing. More recently the cross has been moved to the 9/11 museum and memorial.

As we approach the anniversary of 9/11 each year, one of the things that I am reminded of was that I was able to listen to the stories of those who were there on the day. Staying in New York just 4 years later meant I heard several people, who witnessed the tragedy unfold, tell their stories. And that was a privilege that I hadn't been expecting. Listening to others and hearing their stories is something I have very much learnt to appreciate since that time. It's something that I do when I meet with a family to organise the funeral of a loved one, or when I talk to parents about the hopes and dreams, they have for their children as we prepare for their christening. And indeed, it's something I love about helping couples plan for their wedding day. As someone who can easily

be impatient, learning to listen to peoples' stories is perhaps the most wonderful thing about being a priest. And I think that's one of the reasons why I enjoy working with St Joseph's infants and junior schools too. Because schools are also places full of stories. Places where our young people explore not just their own hope and dreams, and of course learn about English, or Maths or science. They also learn about the stories of others too and in doing so be encouraged about what the future holds.

The I4th September, Holy Cross Day this year, is also education Sunday, a day to pray for all those in education, and to particularly pray for our school, the staff, the governors and all the children. And pray that each day, whether its though Zena and Fr Paul's or my assemblies, the children will have an opportunity to hear stories and to share different experiences as they learn what it means to have faith in God. I hope and pray that this month we might take the opportunities, where we can, to listen to others, no matter how old or indeed young they are, and to thank God for the privilege of hearing their stories and learning from them.

#### New Icon of St Peter and St Paul



One of the things that I loved about St. Paul's when I looked around the church was the icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary and child. The icon was written by the Rev'd Philip Meader, a retired priest living in Chichester, who has been an iconographer for many years. During the recent redecoration work on St. Paul's, he offered the icon to us as a gift and a stand in which to display it was made by the contractor who was undertaking the work.

After I became Rural Dean, I was introduced to Philip and after thanking

him for sharing his talents with us I asked whether he would consider writing another one, for the other side of the sanctuary arch so as to balance things out. He quickly agreed, asking that we just cover his costs. We discussed which icon would be the most appropriate and it quickly became apparent that he should write an icon of SS. Peter and Paul together. An image of the two parishes of St Peter the Great and St Paul's coming together in 1980.

The icon of Peter and Paul embracing is well-known in the orthodox church. Some Christians though, have found it an uncomfortable image, because, as Paul's letter to the Galatians reminds us, although he acknowledges Peter to be one of the pillars of the church, they fall out. Paul rebukes Peter at Antioch, accusing him of hypocrisy.

But there is some wisdom from our orthodox brothers and sisters. The Karakallou monastery on Mount Athos tells us that the icon symbolizes the meeting of the foremost apostles in Rome, representing ecumenical peace and brotherhood.

It is then an image which relates to the vision of St Paul's as a place of sanctuary, hospitality and spiritual encounter. It is an image that reminds us how we are

meant as faithful Christians, to live together before God. Even if we sometimes disagree, we can still live and work together, and through the grace and the love of God, work towards reconciliation with one another in obedience to Jesus's command to love one another.

I am grateful to Philip for prayerfully writing another beautiful icon, and I'm grateful too to James Thatcher, a carpenter who worships at our 8am Sunday service, for making an identical stand for the new icon to be displayed on.

Over the coming months the PCC will be looking at other ways to further enhance our worship space and continue the legacy begun with the vision for St Paul's renewed. That will include considering the addition of a specially commissioned altar frontal to help us focus on God in worship, and also improvements to both audio visual and sound systems. Music desks (known as readers) for members of the choir are also on the wish list, and, if possible, the replacement of the existing chairs with ones that are more easily moved and stackable, including some with arms for those for whom that would help. Watch this space!

Many visitors speak of finding something they didn't know they needed—whether it's a book, a word of encouragement, or a moment of calm in the busyness of life.

Managed and staffed by a dedicated Christian team, the bookshop supplies and supports local churches and communities while remaining open to people of faith and of none. It also regularly hosts events, author talks, and seasonal displays that reflect the rhythms of the liturgical year.

If you're visiting Chichester, or are lucky enough to live nearby, make sure to drop in. St Olav Christian Bookshop is more than a shop—it's a ministry of presence, a quiet light in the city, and a reminder that sometimes, the best discoveries happen when and where you least expect them.

#### CONFIDE COUNSELLING

This year marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of Confide Counselling. For 40 years, Confide has been seeking to offer affordable professional counselling support to people.

Confide is now based at St Paul's. When the Parish Centre was recently refurbished, a small room was included, suitable for one-to-one meetings, and this is well used by Confide.



Confide was initially established by the Chichester and Bognor Methodist Church circuit. They had become very aware of their need for training to enable them to be more effective in their pastoral work. Confide grew as other churches joined us. Confide is now an independent charity and involves people from a number of different churches in Chichester and Bognor. We are a member of the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy

At present, we have 21 counsellors and meet with clients at the Friends Meeting House in Bognor as well as at St Paul's. We also work closely with Stonepillow.

St Paul's has been involved with Confide for many years, offering financial support. As well as the use of rooms in the Parish Centre, several members of the congregation serve as trained counsellors, and several as trustees. At present, I chair the trustees- a role which I took over from Canon Simon Holland.

To mark this significant anniversary and to celebrate the work of Confide, there will be a special focus on Confide at the 10 am Parish Eucharist on Sunday, 28<sup>th</sup> September. We will be giving thanks and praying for the work of Confide, and it will be an opportunity to learn more about this ministry.

We are very aware that there is now as great a need for this work as there was when we were first established 40 years ago.


