## **Musings**

This Sunday, 28<sup>th</sup> September is the Harvest Service in St Nicholas and the following Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October will be the harvest at Chetwynd. Over many years I have attended many Harvest Services in both rural and urban settings and over the years I have seen changes. I grew up in a city church but I remember that at harvest the church was filled with fresh vegetables and fruit. They covered the windowsills and any flat surface, were in front of the altar and down each side of the chancel. And in the centre, a baked sheaf of corn. Then after the service the fruit and vegetables would be distributed among the elderly in the parish. This was gratefully received, although perhaps not always. I can remember an elderly man, a widower, living alone who looked rather surprised as he stood on his doorstep holding an enormous cabbage. There probably would have been enough to feed him for six months!

Nowadays most churches collect gifts for the Food Banks. The church is no longer so wonderfully decorated, it doesn't have that harvest smell. But it is probably a more practical development. The food collected goes to those who need it most and because it is not fresh produce nothing is wasted. And still the church is decorated with flowers and foliage. We still sing the harvest hymns and pray for farmers and growers and all in the food chain who bring the food to our shops.

And it is good that we take one day a year to remember the goodness of our Creator God. God, who has created our world so that everything in it can go on from generation to generation. Tiny seeds become big plants which produce more seeds giving abundant food for animals and people. And on this day, as we ought to on every day, we give thanks for our food and for so much more that God provides. We may 'plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the land' but it is God who gives it life and makes it grow. Let us bless the Lord.
