# From The Rectory ...

Recently, I had the privilege of leading a Memorial Service for the late Tom Rothery of Earl Soham, who served with the Duke of Wellington Regiment, seeing active service in Korea. The service had representatives from the Royal British Legion attending, acting as Standard Bearers, from both local and county levels, which caught my attention, and I found myself asking questions about their role in providing support to serving personnel, veterans and their families. In turn, I discussed their role with my two younger children who are staying with me for half-term, and I immediately realised that I have a duty to keep the Act of Remembrance alive for my children, providing a legacy for them, ensuring that the memories that we have of the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedoms and protected our way of life, are kept alive... perhaps a legacy that we all have a duty to share with the generations to come?

In view of this, I have 'borrowed' some text that provides a simple, but important overview of Remembrance Sunday and the role of the Poppy that we wear proudly each year.

#### What is Remembrance Sunday?

Remembrance Sunday is a national opportunity to remember the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedoms and protected our way of life, most notably, the Armed Forces and their families in Britain and the Commonwealth, our emergency services and all those who have lost their lives as a result of conflict or terrorism.

An annual National Service of Remembrance at The Cenotaph in Whitehall on the second Sunday in November is mirrored in communities all over the UK and the Commonwealth. They provide a focus to remind us about all those who have served their country and made a sacrifice.

#### What does the Poppy Mean?

The poppy is a symbol of Remembrance for all who have lost their lives on active service, from the beginning of the First World War right up to the present day and includes innocent civilians who have died in conflicts and acts of terrorism. While the wearing of a poppy is primarily an overt show of support for the service and sacrifice of our Armed Forces, veterans and emergency services, it also honours the

wider contribution of civil society including the uniformed and youth services that contribute to national peace and security.

# How did a paper poppy become part of our national culture of Remembrance?

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, wrote his famous poem "In Flanders Fields" after seeing poppies growing in battle-scarred fields.

In Flanders' fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place: and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe;
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high,
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders' Fields.

"In Flanders Fields" inspired Moina Michael, an American, to campaign for the poppy to be adopted as an official symbol in memory of those who had fallen in the World War 1. In 1921, Earl Haig, founder of the British Legion, agreed to adopt the poppy as the emblem of Remembrance. That same year, 9 million poppies were sold in the UK.

#### What happens to the funds raised by the British Legion's sales of poppies?

All of the money raised from the sale of poppies goes towards providing support to serving personnel, veterans and their families with particular emphasis on funding charities that support those with physical disabilities and mental health issues arising from their service.

Please buy a poppy this year, wear it with pride and, in so doing, support the British Legion and the fantastic work it does to help those damaged by their service in conflict zones.

#### PHILIP GRIMSEY, 1966-2025, RIP, THANK YOU

It was with great shock and sadness that I learned of my brother's tragic death as the result of an horrendous accident on the family farm at Orford whilst abroad at the beginning of September.

Philip along with my sisters and I spent his childhood at Monk Soham. Our parents having moved from Low Farm [Ashfield] the short distance across the fields to Woodcroft Hall [Monk Soham] in 1964. Upon leaving Debenham Modern School in 1982 having passed his tractor driving test at 16 year's old he started making regular trips to and from Orford moving the farm equipment there to a larger farm that my Father had bought. [This farm had belonged to my Great Grandfather between the wars so the opportunity to buy it was one my Father relished]. Once the move was complete my brother along with the other staff employed set about getting the farm into good shape as it was somewhat rundown in 1982. Over the ensuing 43 years my brother worked tirelessly farming to the high standards expected by my late Father. On a number of occasions the farm won the 'Best Kept Farm' in Suffolk awards, something that doesn't happen without hard work and attention to detail!

Whilst there are few people now in Ashfield who will remember Philip I have drawn much comfort from all of the kind messages I have received over the last few weeks and on both my and the family's behalf I would like to thank you all for thinking of us at this very difficult time.

#### **CHURCHYARD - BEECH TREE**

The large beech tree in the churchyard which was earlier this year deemed to be in terminal decline has now been felled thus removing the danger to our neighbours and the church itself. At the time of writing this it all remains in the churchyard awaiting clearance. We are hoping that it will be possible to sell the lower part of the trunk for milling timber to recoup at least some of the significant expense incurred in taking the tree down. Because of its position the tree had to be brought down branch by branch, drop felling wasn't an option. In due course steps will be taken to remove the smaller timber for firewood. There is also a quantity of woodchip available although it probably should be left stacked for a few months before use.
