O Lord, we beseech you mercifully to hear the prayers of your people who call upon you; and grant that they may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfil them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

I have to admit that I feel for the disciples. Jesus has been asking a lot of them – to give away their possessions, to forgive those who wrong them to take up his cross, and more. No wonder they ask for more faith. Then, when the disciples recognize their need and ask him for help, for more faith, you'd think Jesus would grant their request. But he doesn't. Instead,

he rebukes them. 'If you had even a speck of faith...,' he begins. But what if the question the disciples ask is wrong-headed? Look at it that way, and we see that Jesus is pointing them to the miraculous presence of God all around them and the totally-sufficient faith they already have. Here's the thing: servants aren't invited to the table with the landowner; they eat when their work is done. Nor do they deserve great thanks simply for doing their job; they just do it. That's more what faith is like—simply the willingness to do what needs to be done. Faith is not some kind of scarce resource that needs to be saved, spent, added to, and all the rest. And faith isn't always heroic. Indeed, it usually isn't, but simply doing what needs to be done great or mundane, just because it needs doing.
