Hymn Books



Together Middlesbrough and Cleveland has been undergoing a lengthy change of circumstances, but their new arrangements are now almost completed.

Feast of Fun operated over the summer months, providing holiday time meals and activities at various venues.

The statistics on poverty and child poverty in the North East remain among the highest in the country. The government's published data shows that, in the three years to 2023/24, in our region 31% (170,000) of all babies, children and young people were living below the poverty line. A report on the National Child Poverty plan shows that the situation continues to get worse.

TMC has never been more needed – volunteering, fundraising, and information sharing are vital. The merger with Middlesbrough Voluntary Development Agency (MVDA) is almost complete.
