



CRETINGHAM NOTES



SPEED LIMIT THROUGH THE VILLAGE

Speeding through Cretingham continues to be an issue and one which, God forbid, may result in serious injury or worse. Putting our clocks back to GMT means that many more daily commuting



journeys are made in darkness and dog-walkers may be more likely to be on the roads after 4pm.

The illuminating SID (Speed Indicator Device) causes about half of the drivers to slow and brake when it flashes its red, angry face showing their excess speed. However, over 40% of drivers ignore the SID and don't touch their brakes or take their foot off the accelerator. The recently distributed 30mph wheelie-bin stickers delivered to households within the 30mph zone are a visual and repeated reminder as drivers pass through – but only on a Wednesday.

I have been approached by several villagers seeking solutions to this perennial problem. One option is to apply for membership of the Community Speedwatch (CSW) scheme sponsored by Suffolk Police. You may have seen volunteers undertaking this task in other villages - Debach is a nearby example. Using equipment supplied by the Police, the volunteers record the date, time, make and model of vehicle of those exceeding the speed limit.

This information is passed to the County CSW Administrator who sends a warning letter to the registered keeper of the vehicle. Persistent offenders and high speeders are added to a tasking list for Police intervention.

An important step in getting a CSW group active in Cretingham is for the Parish Council to endorse the application. I propose to add such a discussion to the agenda of the Council meeting on 14-1-26 (7.30pm in Monewden Village Hall).

However, prior to that meeting it would helpful to have a straw-poll of opinions from across the village about the concept of a CSW group and whether it is an appropriate option worthy of consideration. There might also be other solutions that could be considered. In any case there will be an opportunity to discuss this with your Councillors at the PC






