

Join the rebellion!

As we turn the calendar toward December, it often feels as though the world collectively hits the accelerator. There is a pressure to rush and tick the endless boxes before the big day. The noise around us values speed, volume, and instant outcomes above all else. Into this commercial inertia, the season of Advent offers a gentle, counter-cultural invitation to slow down.

It might seem strange to think of slowing down as "rebellious," but in our current climate, perhaps that is exactly what it is. To step back from the hyper-stimulated rush is a quiet act of resistance. It is a refusal to believe that faster is always better.

The Japanese theologian Kosuke Koyama once beautifully described God as a "Three Mile an Hour God." Why three miles an hour? Because that is roughly human walking speed. God, in His infinite love, chose not to race ahead of us or zip past us. In the Incarnation, He chose to walk beside us, at a pace that allows for genuine connection. Love, Koyama argues, takes time. It cannot be rushed. When we are sprinting through December, life becomes a blur. We miss the details. Advent is a sacred invitation to decelerate to walking speed so that we can actually notice.

We need to slow down enough to notice what God is doing in the quiet corners of our lives. Perhaps even more importantly, we need to slow down enough to notice the people around us. At three miles an hour, we have time to see the tired eyes of a neighbour, or the loneliness of a friend, or the silent struggle of someone finding this time of year difficult. We will find it very difficult to care for people while rushing past them.

The world might imply that pausing is wasteful when there is so much to be done. But there is a different wisdom to draw from , In Hebrew, the language of the ancient texts of the Old Testament, the word for waiting is Qavah— and it's the same word for hoping and expecting.

So, this Advent, I invite you to join this gentle rebellion. Pause, watch, wait, and listen. Dare to walk slowly. In doing so, you might just find yourself in step with God, noticing both the needs of others and the quiet miracles unfolding along the way.

May you receive the compassion and peaceful presence of the God who walks slowly.







Many of you may know that since my visit to Israel/Palestine in 2022 Steve and I have been actively supporting the Princess Basma Centre for Disabled children and their families from the West Bank. Run and funded totally by the Diocese of Jerusalem as a charity organisation. Having visited the Centre, and with our daughter being a paediatric physio in North Devon working with disabled children, I recognised the value and importance of this facility. This was some 14 months prior to the commencement of the War in October 2023.

The Centre is based in East Jerusalem, which is on occupied Palestinian land. In addition they have a unit based in the Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza City. This hospital is also run by the Diocese of Jerusalem, initially it was an orthopaedic hospital, but at the outbreak of the War it became a light in the darkness for all. Bombed or attacked 8 times, thousands were given shelter there and thousands have died there. It remained open and functioned as best it could, being the only functioning hospital left in Northern Gaza.

Steve and I will be hosting an Open House on Thursday 18th December at 37 Mill Street. There will be seasonal refreshments and information on the Basma Centre. Everyone welcome, 10am -9pm.

Earlier this month, five of our Gaza staff were displaced to the south and worked out of their temporary shelters, whilst our remaining staff worked out of our unit in Gaza City.

Even in this extreme emergency, our team, 'together' in different geographical locations treated 76 beneficiaries in the first week of October.

Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.



GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

CHURCH TOWER ILLUMINATION:

During the Winter season, our church tower is floodlit by public subscription. It is a beacon of welcome and warmth, visible for miles around. We hope that you all enjoy the spectacle.

We will shortly be announcing the means by which anyone can sponsor a period of tower lighting (by the week or the month). We will publish this directly and also on the Coldridge Facebook page.

You can choose to sponsor in memory of a loved one or of a special occasion, such as a Birthday, Wedding Anniversary or any other occasion significant in your life.
