DECEMBER 2025 NEWSLETTER

Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which we hope will keep you informed of what's happening in our parish life, the community and also more widely.

Recently I was transported back to my late teens when studying for my teaching degree. One of our texts for English Literature was Twelfth Night and it was the opening lines I remembered - *If music be the food of love, play on.....'*. The context I was thinking about the quote in, is very different to the original meaning behind Shakespeare's prose. This thought process started as several of us will be following a newly published booklet of Advent daily readings and reflections which is based on Handel's Messiah. (*Hallelujah-Journeying through Advent with Handel's Messiah by Dave & Sally Gobbett*).

Not being particularly familiar with classical music in general and only knowing of the Hallelujah Chorus, so easily recognisable, I of course googled the history of Handel's Messiah! It truly is an inspiring story to hear how Handel composed the music in one long 24 day period using the text by Charles Jennens, compiled from the King James Bible and the Coverdale Psalter. This was the Christian context in which I was thinking about the Twelfth Night quote- 'music, food and nourishment'. Music truly can be an uplifting experience, emotional, evocative, nourishing. And even more so when matched with words straight from scripture. So many modern hymns and some traditional ones too, use words directly from scripture and they are often among my favorites for this very reason. Setting scripture to music is also a good way to learn bible verses that may help sustain, encourage, reassure and nourish you, as much as it does me.

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation and what better way to spend it, than in diving deeper into the bible, learning more of God's relationship with his people and in so doing, 'feeding' our own faith and relationship with our living God. During Advent you may like to set aside some extra time for prayer, spending time with God, and not just speaking, requesting, and listing your prayers, but spending time in silence listening to the 'still small voice' of God which can often only be heard when we make space and time, and wait in silence. Do also come and join in with one of the Advent Courses on offer, to learn, pray and journey together.

The opening lines of Handel's Messiah are taken from the first verses of Isaiah 40 and are about comfort hope and encouragement for the people of Israel who were in Exile. The same themes apply to us still today as we await God's

return. We too are reassured of God's eternal presence, faithfulness and enduring love, as we are invited to 'prepare the way for the Lord' and 'make straight paths' (40.3). In doing so 'God's Glory' will be revealed' (40.5) and throughout it all, God will sustain, strengthen and encourage the faithful. The whole of chapter 40 is an important one in the bible which I commend to you for your reflection through this 'new liturgical year' as Advent begins once again.

The final words of the chapter are particular ones I have held onto for much of my own Christan journey, for hope, comfort and reassurance and I leave you with these as we all embark on our individual and collective Advent journey's.


COMMUNITY CHURCHYARD WORK PARTY






