If we can do this then we can move forward into the New Year safe in the knowledge that the small patch of earth which we each inhabit can be made better by our actions.

So, leaving you with this thought, I wish you a joyous and peaceful Christmas, and a healthy and contented New Year.





Our fantastic final service in the run up to Christmas – join us for this **festively traditional service** welcoming in Christmas Day, held by candelight.



Waterford Nature Notes

Here's a good word for a crossword: 'allopreening', my Somerset Correspondent told me of this after he had watched one of a pair of Jackdaws grooming the other. I have only ever known this interaction between birds, and the word is specific to birds, as 'social grooming'.

If you entered a supermarket or visited a farm shop in October, you will have seen thousands of pumpkins for sale, one local supermarket had 3,200kgs on display. The pumpkins won't be used for food, but for Hallowe'en decorations, the boxes are labelled as "carving pumpkins". It is estimated that around 3500 acres of land were

used to grow pumpkins, this is agricultural land that has been taken out of food production. Estimates give a figure of an average of 2,200 plants per acre, the total number is, therefore 7,700,000 plants. Each plant needs around an average through its life of 73 litres of water per week. The growing time from seed to harvest is approximately 15 weeks. The quantity of water consumed is, therefore: 7,700,000 x 73 x 15, an inexpressible number on a calculator. Using long multiplication, that works out at 8,430,500,000 litres of water. London's largest reservoir is the King George V, in the Lea Valley at Chingford, which holds 12,492,000,000 litres, so two thirds of that huge reservoir



(view it on an OS map and search on-line for the water levels during droughts) is used every year just to grow pumpkins for decoration. Stop it! Hallowe'en Pumpkins are a recent import from the USA, sometime in the 1980's. It is not the farmers that are to blame for this waste of land and water, farmers are having to diversify to make ends meet, if they were paid a fair price for producing food, they wouldn't need to chase the market.

Incidentally, in the mid to late 1980's, when our children were at Junior School, we went to a parents' evening, we asked why our children were not being taught long division and multiplication, the answer was that nobody uses it because we have calculators - see above regarding calculator unable to cope. The teacher asked when I had last used long arithmetic, that very day I had had to calculate my use of an overtime budget for the forthcoming year, computers weren't a common feature of life, and my employer at the time didn't provide calculators so I was forced back on long arithmetic. Apart from that, the use of various forms of arithmetic, including mental, which our children also weren't taught, leads to skills in numeracy. Many people of my generation and earlier can calculate the VAT on a sale faster than the shop assistant that is using a calculator.



Wouldn't you just know it, yet another failure in what was dreamed-up as a good scheme, "Carbon offset". The idea was for companies, governments, even individuals, to plant trees to offset their carbon emissions, e.g. from air travel. Many thousands of acres of trees, usually quick-growing conifers, were planted, taking up yet more agricultural land. Trees are now so stressed that they are creating more carbon than they are taking up. A few years ago a Welsh, tenant hill farmer tried to buy a farm that was for sale, he arranged the banking and was just about to close the purchase when the land agent told him that the owner had received a better offer. The offer was from a Swiss firm that sold carbon

offset credits. The farm was taken out of food production. Incidentally, the Swiss firm receives a grant from our government for offsetting carbon, which is no longer happening.

I wasn't able to go to Abbotsbury Swannery for the Cygnet Release this year. My Somerset correspondent reported that they ringed around 200 cygnets, I think the number last year was less than half that. The Swannery had events planned for their final week but had to refund people that had bought tickets because they had to close one week early due to Avian flu being found in the colony. 
