

My harvest highlight this year.

I was at St Mary's and St Gabriel's, Binbrook this year for their Harvest Festival. They had all the things you'd expect from such an event - familiar harvest hymns, produce displayed and then donated to a local food bank, arrangements of flowers, sheaves of grain, a larger than normal congregation, and a basket at the centre of the display containing a traditional large Harvest Loaf surrounded by bunches of grapes.

At the end of the service we gathered together for the customary tea, coffee, biscuits and chat, but instead of biscuits, the Harvest Loaf and the grapes were brought from the display at the front and we helped ourselves to chunks of freshly baked bread and grapes. Such a wonderful way of linking the harvest themes of gratitude and sharing with our post-service refreshments. I understand the loaf was also shared with a baptismal party that same afternoon and that Father Terry requested that perhaps next year we could also have some butter!
