Reflection: Sunday 16th November 2nd Sunday before Advent

In today's extract from Paul's letter to the Thessalonians he addresses the problem of idleness among believers. Some in the Thessalonian church had stopped working, perhaps thinking Jesus 'return was so near that daily labour no longer mattered. Paul firmly instructs them to follow his example - he worked hard, did not depend on others for food, and lived responsibly.

This message is still relevant. We may not face the exact same problem of idleness, but we do live in a world that struggles with extremes - some of us work ourselves to exhaustion, while others withdraw.

However, in the eyes of God, every honest effort, every act of love, every quiet deed of faithfulness matters deeply. Christian life is not just about believing, it's about living our faith. Our work, whatever it may be, is part of our worship. As the hymn says, 'What we do in any thing, we do it Lord, for thee.'

Paul's words in the last sentence could be a motto for us: 'Do not be weary in doing what is right'. Yet every post, every advert break on television, every newspaper brings a plea for us to donate to some worthy charity and doing good feels tiring and impossible. Paul reminds us: Don't stop. Don't give up. Don't grow weary. To be more positive: Do what you can because even when no

one seems to notice, God sees. Even if our contribution feels small, God blesses it and even when the world seems dark, the light of Christ shines through those who keep doing good.

As a church family, we're called to work faithfully, not just for wages, but as service to God; support one another; encourage responsibility in all and persevere in loving and caring, not letting cynicism or fatigue stop us. Let the the world see Christ at work in our community.

Bible Readings: Sunday 16th November 2025 2nd Sunday before Advent

Malachi 4.1-2a

4 See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch.

2 But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.

2 Thessalonians 3.6-13

6 Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us.

7 For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you,

8 and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you.

9 This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate.

10 For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat.

11 For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work.

12 Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

13 Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

Luke 21.5-19

5 When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said,

6 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.'

7 They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?'
8 And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.

- 9 'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.'
- 10 Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom;
- 11 there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.
- 12 'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name.
- 13 This will give you an opportunity to testify.
- 14 So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance;

15 for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict.

16 You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death

- 17 You will be hated by all because of my name.
- 18 But not a hair of your head will perish.
- 19 By your endurance you will gain your souls.

- 8 Let the sea thunder and all that fills it, the world and all that dwell upon it.

I'm sorry it's taken so long for me to write to thank you for your friendship and your gift to us as a family. We are actually hosting a barbecue in a couple of weeks or families with teenagers. We have been warmly welcomed into the churches of the Glaven Valley, Hugo and Ethan have settled into new schools, Amber is continuing her dance studies in Leicester and commuting home at weekends and Emma and I are in the process of discerning where are priorities for ministry might lie. Jubilee Foodbank Market Harborough

You can drop off donations at Hallaton Church or to Linda Jones at **25**, **Eastgate**, **Hallaton** at any time. Please note that all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned.

The Foodbank has MOST URGENT NEED of: Tinned Fruit, Tinned Sweetcorn, Baked Beans with

sausages, Cereal, Tinned Ham, Crackers.

They also need:

UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Tinned chicken, Hot Dogs (Tins or jars,) Tinned red meat, Tinned Carrots, Corned Beef, Tinned meatballs, Chicken in sauce, Dried potatoes (Smash), Marmalade, Jam, Biscuits, Tinned potatoes, Crisps, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned chickpeas, mixed chilli beans, lentils, Custard, Tinned rice pudding, Sachet meals (pan or microwave), 'No Cook' meals for the homeless, Cordial, Coffee (small jars) Fray Bentos pies, Pasta sauce, Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Sugar (500g), Tinned peas, Tinned vegetarian meals, such as veggie chilli, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/juice, Microwave puddings, Pasta sauce, Peanut butter, Tinned Pasta, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Interfaith Round Table in Parliament

Bishop Martyn recently attended a high-level interfaith discussion in the House of Lords.

Representatives of different faith communities were present, including the new Minister of State for Faith and Communities, Miatta Fahnbulleh, and the new interfaith adviser, and the new inter-faith adviser to the Prime Minister, Dilwar Hussain.

The meeting was called to address perceived breakdown in community relations following the conflict in Gaza and Israel, as well as local disturbances in many towns and cities last summer.

All those present were united in their view that the country faces very serious challenges in terms of relationships between different faith communities, even in places where relationships have traditionally been very strong, such as Leicester.

Inter Faith Week began on Sunday 9 November and is a time to remember together the contributions of all faiths and none, and to consider how best we can create a just, peaceful, and harmonious world. **Read more here:** https://www.leicester.anglican.org/news/inter-faith-week-2025.php
