<u>Silence</u>

As we observe the annual ceremonies of remembrance again this year, we may have been alerted once more to the power of silence. Two short minutes convey more than any words could. In a world which has become increasingly noisy over the decades, it's heartening to see how many younger, as well as older members of society actively choose to observe this tradition.

The silence is an opportunity for our own reflections and we make use of it in a variety of ways. As I've moved around our Deanery over past weeks, I've been struck by the number and poignancy of personal and communal memories that this time of year brings to the surface. For younger people, and maybe some of us oldies too who are far too addicted to the babble of media, it also enforces attention, which is, of course, a well-practised spiritual virtue. Indeed, whenever I'm involved in corporate acts of silence, I am transported to the Great Silence observed daily in monastic communities, as well as the hours of silent worship I shared with Friends as a Quaker for 34 years.

Silence can bring us together like nothing else and, in the right context it can be immensely healing, enabling our relationships to find harmony and restoring, if fleetingly, those values we collectively try to remember and uphold. However, silence can also be used as a weapon of coercion and manipulation and anyone who has found themselves 'shut out' of a conversation or situation will know the pain and frustration this brings.

So- as we move from silence to perhaps our busiest time of year, let's be mindful of good silences and bad silences and aim to bring more of the former and exclude the latter wherever we come across it. Denise is valiantly trying to help us to engage in communication as a Deanery so let's help and encourage each other by keeping in touch!

Tathwell Remembrance Sunday 2025

About 40 people assembled at the War Memorial in Tathwell on Sunday 9

November for the annual wreath-laying. The service was led by Helen

Marsden who, once she had opened our worship, asked that the names of the
fallen as shown on the War Memorial be read out. At her request those
gathered offered the names of members of their own families who had fallen
in conflict, and those who had returned. Then the wreath was laid by Rowena
Larkin representing Tathwell and Haugham Parish Council and a number of
individual crosses added. Helen read the verses by Binyon and the two
minute silence was observed.

Once the National Anthem had been sung most people walked up to St Vedast's church where Liz Marshall played us in and the service continued with readings and the hymns I *vow to thee my country, Eternal Father strong to save and God is our strength and refuge*. A collection of £120 was, as in previous years, shared with the Royal British Legion.
