Pastoral Letter - Pam Priestley

Dear All,

About a year ago I bought a book recommended to me by a friend entitled 'The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry'. I only began reading it a few weeks ago. Why? I told myself that I didn't have time - too busy! When we ask others the customary question, 'How are you?' the answer is often, 'Oh ok, just busy.' Perhaps the 'busy' label gives us a certain importance and when circumstances or age takes it away we are left feeling redundant.

As we know, the spread of Covid for many was a time of sadness and loss but for some it was liberating in that they found time to enjoy again the companionship of friends and family, to delight in the natural world and to rethink priorities. Some, as a result, changed direction completely and adopted a less hurried form of existence. Others returned to the busyness.

At this time of year a lot of the busyness is associated with preparations for Christmas - cards, presents, food. For others it is about struggling and worrying about the money to buy any of these.

We are now in the season of Advent and strangely enough, what is important at this time of year in the church is completely opposite to the bustle around us. Advent is a time of waiting, reflecting, anticipating what lies ahead. Mary waited 9 months for the birth of Jesus and spent time pondering on the words of the angel and what they could mean. She spent time with her cousin Elizabeth as they marvelled together and were excited about what God was doing and what it all meant.

We hope that many of you reading this will come to one of the church Carol services. It could so easily be another thing on the 'list' to do and tick off but perhaps we could allow ourselves to come with quiet receptive hearts ready to hear again of the precious gift God gave to the world and be willing to receive and believe and as John the apostle writes, to become children of God.

Community First Responders

"As a First Responder for a number of years I was called out to five cardiac arrests. When this happens it is essential help is delivered quickly. People need to know where Defibrillators are in their area. I was recently called out to a very good friend who had gone into Cardiac Arrest. One First Responder came and did a wonderful job and together we did our best. It just made me think why do more people not come forward for first aid training, so that they can save a life. First responding is one of the most rewarding things you can do. The First Responder can speak to the ambulance service and a call can be upgraded. They offer reassurance in the most awful circumstances people find themselves in. Training is excellent, and yes you do have to give commitment. But the rewards are immense. So please do think about offering your services to our community."

Seasons Greetings! Wishing you all a peaceful, restful and happy Christmas AND New Year!

Working for nature in our parish

Councillor Kevin Wiley joined a group of enthusiastic and hard working volunteers planting 600 primroses on Bethacar Moor last month as part of a project to boost biodiversity and provide essential habitat for the Duke of Burgundy butterfly; a species that is only found in a small number of locations across the country and that we are privileged to have on our doorstep in the Colton Parish Area.

We've also been standing up for nature in our response to a local consultation on the forthcoming Bluebird K7 - The Festival, planned to take place in Coniston in May 2026. Whilst we recognise the social and economic benefits, and we understand how much enjoyment many people get from events like this, we want to make sure that the wildlife that depends on the lake and its shore are protected from noise, pollution and disturbance, especially at a time of year when there are nesting and fledging birds. We've urged organisers to take steps to keep disruption to wildlife and the East of Lake area to a minimum.

Flooding

With the increasing frequency winter storms, bringing heavy rain and wind, we all need to be aware of the steps to take when there are floods

- If the blocked drain is on a local lane email clerk@coltonparishcouncil.org.uk and we'll ask our Lengthsman Archie to take a look

Priority Services Register

All utility companies are required to hold a Priority Services Register to ensure they

offer appropriate support to vulnerable people. This includes support during extended power cuts. Those eligible include anyone with a medical need, people over the state pension age, families with children under 5 or expecting a baby. Torver Parish Council

TPC convened on the 6th of November with all councillors present and two members of the public in attendance. Julie Ward was co-opted to fill the vacancy on the council. Discussions on managing water runoff from the fells continued with valuable input from Richard Graham and John Barr snr. Solutions will require collaboration with relevant authorities and agencies. Concerns were raised regarding future parking arrangements on the common opposite the former Land Rover garage; a satisfactory resolution will require further deliberation. The meeting concluded with the resignation of the Chair, Peter Worth. Councillors expressed appreciation for Peter's leadership and dedication. Chris Bradley, the new Chair, made a presentation on behalf of the council. Peter is relocating to the northeast to be closer to family. The next council meeting is scheduled for **Thursday 8th January 2026** at 7.30pm in the Schoolroom.

Coniston Parish Council and the Surgery Planning Application

There has been some confusion about the Parish Council position on the application for a surgery and social housing on land adjoining the Bluebird Car Park. After discussion at the 18th August 2025 meeting the PC resolved to support the principle of the development but subject to two conditions. The minutes record:

- "Support subject to conditions that before development starts contracts be in place (1) with a registered social landlord regarding the social housing, and (2) a provider of GP services regarding the surgery."*

The aim of the conditions was to reduce the risk that after construction the building might not in practice actually be available on terms acceptable to the NHS and a social housing provider.

Coniston Surgery Update

Nearly 3 months since our GP practice changed, what has happened and what have the Coniston Patients Group (CPG) been doing?

- Under the new management by the Morecambe Bay Primary Care Collaborative Group (MBPCC) patients are still able to easily make appointments. Also to get flu and Covid jabs
- Following an appeal to the village Coniston Carers have been reorganised.
- Our “old” surgery was placed in the top 4 in England in an NHS survey of Patient Satisfaction as reported in the Evening Mail.
- MBPCC were appointed by The NHS Integrated Care Board (ICB) for an initial 6 months despite the original advertisement being for 12 months. We have just had confirmation from the ICB that the MBPCC group will continue to provide care “for the duration of the procurement process for a replacement GP even if it goes beyond the 6 months”
- The ICB are preparing the contract for a new, permanent GP. The advertisement should be appearing “shortly”
- Surgery premises: while Dr Frey has kindly made the existing surgery available, more accessible premises are needed. We the CPG and the Parish Council have supported a private building application with local occupancy conditions and looked at other possible buildings eg the Tourist Information Centre. The decision will rest with the ICB who move extremely slowly
- 23 October-- 100+ patients attended a Jacob's Join supper at the Institute to say our grateful goodbyes to Drs Frey and Abbas and Rachel, Denise and Sophie whom we all miss so much. Huge thanks from the CPG to everyone who helped; from musicians to clearers-up

44th Annual Coniston 14 Race

The 44th Coniston 14 race will take place on **Saturday 21st March 2026**. In recent years the race has attracted some 1200 runners, many returning each year. It has been described as one of the most scenic and well-managed events in the UK.

Different kinds of runners take part including those wanting to keep fit, to train for marathons, to raise money for their chosen charities, to compete against friends or improve their personal best times.



The run starts at John Ruskin School in Coniston and makes a 14-mile circuit of Coniston water with stunning views over the lake to the Coniston fells. For the safety of the runners there will be the usual short road closure between Coniston and Torver for the start of the race and along Lake Road, Coniston for the finish.

It is a great community event and over 80 volunteers help on the day. We are always pleased to have extra marshals to help. Please contact the race director, Janette Braithwaite: janettemaude@hotmail.com if you wish to volunteer.

We are also keen to attract new members of the committee. Everyone is welcome to attend the Annual General Meeting, which will be held at John Ruskin School on **Monday 8th December** at 6pm.

Each year the Coniston 14 Committee raises some £20,000 from the race and this is donated to about 30 local charities, good causes and clubs in the communities around the lake.

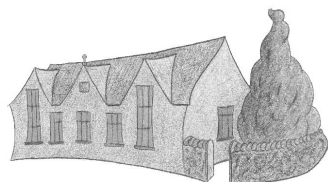

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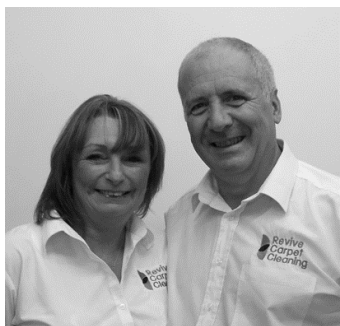
