Thought for Thursday

A few weeks ago, I purchased a chainsaw. In late, midlife crisis some people buy a super car, perhaps a motorcycle or even multiple lathes! However, having pondered, researched, evaluated and final decided what to buy, I placed an order with a well-known online market place and waited the delivery.

What I hadn't evaluated initially was the imperative need for protective equipment in order to safely operate said chainsaw. Helmet with visor and ear protection, leggings with Kevlar inserts, safety boots with steel tow caps and anti-cut gloves, the cost of which is almost as much as the primary equipment.

This reminded me of putting on the armour of Christ as described in Paul's epistle to the Ephesians.

There are numerous examples of saints and others throughout the history of the Church whose lives have been turned upside down and as a result have done amazing things in the power of the spirit.

Sometimes to create new growth we have to drastically prune the old. It looks brutal and leaves a big gap, but soon the new growth flourishes, fills the gap and produces abundantly and sustains production into the future. Hopefully I'll have ash logs to burn for a few more years. (Or if I had the skill turn into something beautiful or useful)
