Do all things without grumbling or questioning that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish, in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life.


Philippians 2: 14-15

We are all baptized children of God and one of the beautiful images of this calling comes at the end of the baptism service when the newly baptized receives a candle, lit (if possible) from the Pascal Candle, with the words, which are said by everyone, "Shine as a light in the world, to the glory of God the Father".

Hallowe'en, together with All Saints and All Souls Days, are the perfect time to reflect on our calling to shine as lights in Shakespeare's 'naughty world' and to wonder if, perhaps, our wicks might need a little trim or our lanterns a polish and, if so, precisely how we might go about this.

One way, which is open to us all year round, is to deliberately move away from the usual distractions of life for a few moments and spend time in stillness. That simple act canand usually does- create the perfect environment to quieten our internal or external chatter and listen for the still small voice of our loving Father and Creator, who longs to come close to each one of us in the silence of our hearts. It doesn't need to be in church. Some folk find gazing at a sunrise or sunset provides this perfect opportunity- for others, it's a walk on the beach or in the woods. I still really miss my little doggie, Toast and especially the beautiful times we spent together in Hubbards Hills where I was aware of God's presence in the sounds of the gently burbling stream and birdsong and the glorious canopy of trees with their ever-changing colours. When I went there with him early on the morning of my surgery, the 23rd Psalm became alive to me like never before, 'The Lord is my Shepherd- he leads me beside still waters- he restores my soul.' Lighting a candle can provide this quiet and reflective opportunity to become aware of God's voice in our hearts. What a beautiful thought, that we're called to shine like candles- to offer God's peace, stillness and hope to a busy and troubled world.







St Andrews Church Utterby will be awash with poppies made by ladies in the village and by people from the Grove Care home in Waltham.






