#### **Reflection for December**

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. (John 13:34)

Dear Friends,

Advent is a time of hopeful waiting. Waiting for Jesus' birth and seeking light in the dark times of winter. Talking to a family member recently, they told me about their annual visit to Salisbury Cathedral for the From Darkness to Light: Advent Procession – a service that starts in darkness and then throughout the service darkness gives way to a thousand lighted candles.

The world is a dark place, full of hurt, war, poverty, anger and it is only through our hopefulness that we can survive the dark times.

As Bishop Mike says in his Advent letter:

The Good News of Advent is that ultimately our hope lies not in our own personal or communal efforts, initiatives or agendas but rather in the God of Advent who drew near to us in the babe of Bethlehem and who will come again to take away the darkness forever and be our eternal light.

Our hope and mission as a parish is for growth, to share the joy of the Gospel a bit further and to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ more broadly in our community and through this develop a thriving community of disciples who can help us spread our hope even further. To do this we need to think about our behaviours and consider what makes us stand out as a group that others might want to join...

So, as we think about Advent, I wonder if we could consider doing something different to count down the days to Christmas to share the joy of the Gospel with those around us:

Perhaps we could start a reverse Advent Calendar – where we add an item every day to a bag or box for the foodbank. Or we could encourage our neighbours to join the Christmas Open Day in St Mary's (see front page for details), to find out more about the story of Christmas through crafts and a Christmas quiz – to find out what we're waiting in hope for this advent.

Wishing you all a blessed and hope-filled Advent and every blessing this Christmas.
