Musings

St Hugh of Lincoln is remembered by the Church on 17th November. He was born in Burgundy in about 1140. His mother was known for her kindness and especially for washing the sores of lepers. Young Hugh would be taken along with her in these ministries and hold the towels. Sadly, his mother died when Hugh was about 8 years old and he was sent to a religious community, Canons Regular of St Augustine, to be educated. Canons Regular were not monks but communities of priests who went out into parishes to help nurse the sick, run schools and rebuild ruined shrines. They would work humbly at these humdrum tasks and at the age of 15 Hugh joined them in their work.

In his twenties, however, he left this life for one of contemplation as a Carthusian monk. His piety reached the ears of King Henry11 of England who appointed him Prior of a new Carthusian monastery in Somerset. He found the monastery incomplete and the monks full of grumbles. He rebuilt the monastery and gained compensation from the king for those who had been forced off their land so that the monastery could be built.

In 1186 he was consecrated Bishop of Lincoln. He travelled widely around his diocese and was known for being generous and just. He also played an active role in the protection of Jews who were being persecuted and would be expelled from England in 1290.

St Hugh loved all the animals in the monastery garden and is usually portrayed with a swan. A wild swan became his constant companion, eating from his hand and protecting him from anyone who got too close.

So what can we learn from the life of St Hugh? Well, he was described in his lifetime as 'uniting patience, courtesy, courage and gentleness'. Someone who 'loved the whole human race like himself.'
