Beating the Bounds in Prayer

As autumn moves into winter, with leaves falling, temperatures dropping, and daylight fading, I find myself reflecting on the summer. One standout memory was joining Mid Derbyshire MP Jonathan Davies on the final day of his walk across the constituency. We met for coffee at the Little Shed and walked together through Allestree Park, then across the fields between Allestree and Quarndon, and into Markeaton Park for a well-earned cuppa.



During our walk, we spoke about many things, including how Jonathan's journey echoed the ancient tradition of *beating the bounds*. I later read a little more about this medieval practice which involved clergy, parishioners, and local dignitaries walking the boundaries of their parish once a year, tapping boundary markers like gates, walls, or trees with sticks. It was a way to reaffirm parish borders and pass on local knowledge, especially in times before maps were common.

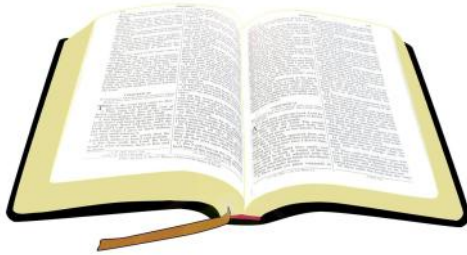
Though the tradition waned after the Reformation and was banned by Oliver Cromwell, it saw a revival in Victorian times. Today, it's largely faded from practice. While I don't foresee us reinstating it literally, the experience of walking through our parishes offered a fresh perspective, seeing familiar places anew and reflecting on our shared community and how God has brought us together as a group of four parishes to seek God's blessing upon our community, to seek its good and to share the good news of Jesus Christ.

This walk reminded me of our own spiritual version of "beating the bounds": our community prayer initiative. We may not be marking territory, but we are intentionally praying for every street and household across our four parishes. It's a way of seeking God's blessing—not in a territorial sense, but in the spirit of the diocesan vision that *the Kingdom of God is good news for all*. Who knows what God might do as we join together in prayer for the people parishes of St Edmund, St Matthew, St Nicholas and St Paul who are known and deeply loved by God.

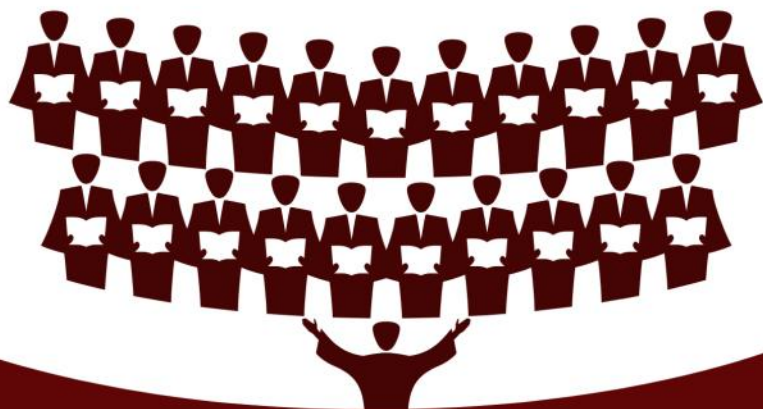

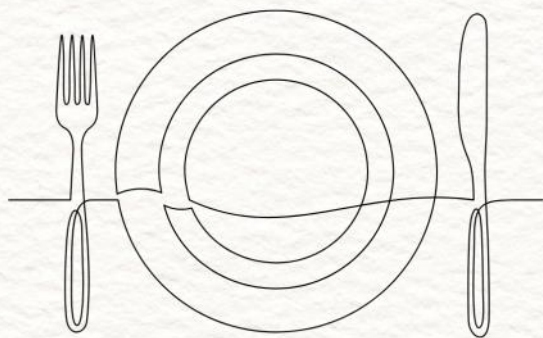
