Thought for Thursday

"If you feel like singing, sing!"

That old Judy Garland song could have been written for me! Anyone who knows me also knows how I love to sing.

My participation in the Messiah at the Royal Albert Hall is described elsewhere in this newsletter but I also sang with the Benefice Choir at the Holy Communion service on Sunday 26 October and at the Mission Day last Saturday as well as with the Glebe Singers at a concert in Spalding on Saturday 25th.

For the last two years a group of us calling ourselves "The Six" have presented concerts at St Pega's to help raise funds for the church. Through a connection via Marie, one of The Six, we were asked if we would like to perform a similar concert in the hall at Christ the Carpenter Church in Dogsthorpe.

I was reminded of these concerts at the Mission Day when we were all asked to look at ourselves and see what skills and talents we have that could be put to use in furthering God's work here in the Benefice and also in the wider world.

Like the Benefice Choir and the Glebe Singers, the Six is a group of people to whom God has given the gift of making music.

My ability to sing and what I do in my role as a reader are gifts that God has given to me, gifts that in some small way I can use in the work of God's kingdom.

I am sure that all of you have gifts – very different from mine that could all be used for the very same purpose.

Do you enjoy gardening? I regard it as an extreme sport for which I don't have the insurance and neither have I been on the training course! There two types of plants – live ones that are green and dead ones that are brown.

Can you make something out of wood or metal? Can you service a car? I wouldn't even know here to start as I have no practical skills whatsoever.

Can you paint or draw? My efforts never turn out as I intended.

Do you enjoy cooking or baking a cake? You wouldn't want to eat mine!

The point is that we are all good at something. We all have different skills and talents, gifts from God in the form of things we can do and that we enjoy doing. As St Paul told the church on Corinth, "There are many gifts, but the same Spirit".

It was amazing at the Mission Day to see how many different and varied facets are involved in carrying out the work of God in a benefice. Christian mission can, indeed, take many different forms – visiting the elderly or lonely, getting shopping for someone who is ill or provided bacon sandwiches on a Saturday morning to name but three!

So, to ask again the question we were asked at our Mission Day, what God-given gifts, skills and talents do you have that you could use in furthering the work of God?

Benefice 2030 - Releasing People for Mission

Over 30 of us came together on Saturday for our **Mission Day**. We started the morning with worship – including two songs of praise sung by the Benefice Choir. Rev Keir spoke about what we are seeking to do in the Benefice, drawing inspiration from the East window in St Pega's; Simon Bysshe spoke about the consultative and development work the Benefice 2030 Working Group has been undertaking, particularly about the Family and Friends groups. Lucy Malcolm spoke about the new Benefice structure, and she and Keir outlined the new roles and how things would operate. Bishop Debbie said how excited she was about the developments in the Benefice and how supportive she was of what we are doing - including reaching out to share our faith and serve our communities.

After a 'bring and share' lunch, Lucy facilitated the afternoon session. We looked at all the roles there are to do the Benefice under main headings, thought about areas we are particularly interested in and put stickers of them on our 'hats'. The video which Roisin has produced (below) shows how that worked and the fun that was had!

There were Q&A sessions before lunch and at the end. Some heartfelt contributions were made, including regarding how 'inclusive' having 'Family and Friends' groups feels and how they will help us to welcome people in Parishes and enable them to use their gifts.

The feedback on the evaluation forms everybody completed was very positive. Overall, 53% felt the day was 'excellent', with 46% feeling it was 'good'. Most felt they understand the key changes being introduced, that they were able to share their views during the day and feel

confident about the next steps – although clearly some uncertainty still exists. Comments on the most helpful part of the day included: 'The explanation of where we are - and why - on the journey to the Benefice wide coordination has been very good'; 'Coming together as one to discuss how we can be the best we can be as a church family'; 'Hearing that Bishop Debbie believes in what we are doing and that we may assist other benefices to travel the same road'.

Thanks to all who attended and contributed to the success of the Mission Day. The Working Group will consider all the thoughts and feedback that have been shared and further information will come out shortly on next steps.

On Sunday 9 November nine members of our Benefice Choir along with a couple of friends from Peterborough Choral Society travelled to the Royal Albert Hall in London to be part of a 3,200 strong choir from 22 different countries to sing Handel's oratorio, Messiah.

Some of us had taken part in this annual event, which is always over-subscribed, in previous years; for others it was their first time.

A pre-dinner drink in a pub was followed by a superb meal at an Italian restaurant in Gloucester Road before we made our way to the venue to join what is officially known as "The Really Big Chorus".

Add to this four professional soloists, a full orchestra and everything conducted by Brian Kay, the bass singer in the original line-up of the Kings Singers, and there is the recipe for a truly great evening of music.

Even though our train home did not arrive in Peterborough until after midnight and the fact that we were all sung out and very tired, everyone of us agreed that it had been a great experience and one we would all like to repeat.




