These wise men studied the stars so when they saw this new star, they knew it was incredibly important so they set off to discover what it meant. They were invited to Come to Bethlehem and believed they would find a baby who was also a King and that is the reason why they brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

When I look at this photograph taken on North Uist it reminds me of the three wise men trekking across the beach.

The real truth is that we celebrate the coming of the baby Jesus at Christmas. We can love God, not because of anything we have done, but because He first loved us.

So when we read or hear the word "Come" how do we respond?

Are we willing to set off on a journey?



Or do we say to ourselves I'll think about it in a while, when I have got time. Maybe when I have got this issue sorted out. Maybe when I have recovered from this illness. Have you ever asked God to help you in these situations? Then perhaps we wouldn't need to spend so much energy trying to sort things out for ourselves.

Jesus said "Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me". This is not the promise of a distant deity, but more a revelation of a God who loves each one of us. Why wait for Christmas, why not just respond to the invitation right now?

New Archbishop of Canterbury



I was delighted by the recent appointment of Dame Sarah Mullaly as 106th Archbishop of Canterbury.

Archbishop Sarah was one of the first women bishops in the Church of England, becoming Bishop of London in 2018.

She comes to the role following a distinguished career. She went into nursing after leaving school and was appointed England's youngest ever Chief Nursing Officer in 1999. She was awarded a Damehood for services to the NHS, before leaving to become a stipendiary curate.

Archbishop Sarah is the Church of England's first woman primate, the first to be educated in a comprehensive school, the first to have been a nurse. In her first statement as Archbishop, she said

"As I respond to the call of Christ to this new ministry, I do so in the same spirit of service to God and to others that has motivated me since I first came to faith as a teenager. At every stage of that journey, through my nursing career and Christian ministry, I have learned to listen deeply - to people and to God's gentle prompting - to seek to bring people together to find hope and healing.

I want, very simply, to encourage the Church to continue to grow in confidence in the gospel, to speak of the love that we find in Jesus Christ and for it to shape our actions. And I look forward to sharing this journey of faith with the millions of people serving God and their communities in parishes all over the country and across the global Anglican Communion.

I know this is a huge responsibility but I approach it with a sense of peace and trust in God to carry me as He always has."

Whether she wishes to be or not, she will inevitably be a pioneer in a Church that faces many challenges. At home, there is a pattern of slow decline and fallout from the safeguarding tragedy that led to her predecessor's resignation. In the Anglican Communion, where she is senior bishop among equals, her appointment has been met with joy in some provinces and rejection from others on the grounds of her gender and theology.

Archbishop Sarah's installation took place in Canterbury Cathedral on March 25th. Please pray for her and her family as she prepares to take up this great responsibility. Please pray too for all who will support her and those who oppose her, that God's transforming presence may be at work in us all.

Thurton Benefice Update

Bergh Apton Gift Day: On behalf of the PCC, may I say a very heartfelt thank you to everyone in the parish of Bergh Apton who contributed to the Gift Day appeal on the 4th October. I have written personally to those whose details I have, but to anyone who gave anonymously please be aware of how grateful we are for your support.

Christmas Services: The full range of Christmas services are in place as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ once again. You are warmly invited to join us as we celebrate the Christmas Season together. *Please see the separate table on Page 5 for details of Carol Services and other services this December.*

The New Organ has finally been installed in St Ethelbert's Church in Thurton. After nearly a year of waiting due to the permissions required and the availability of Mr Richard Bower the organ builder, the new pipe organ was played for the first time by David Catchpole at the Harvest Service on the 19th October. The previous organ had served the church well since it was installed in the 1960s but the new organ offers greater scope for recitals etc and there are plans to hold one to celebrate St Ethelbert's Day in May 2026. Our thanks to the Friends of Thurton Church for organising and funding the new organ and its installation.

The Churches of our benefice belong to all parishioners and far from being a clubhouse for members, they are available at any reasonable time for private prayer and reflection which is why they are kept open during the day. They serve as focal points for important life events and have been used for generations for baptisms, weddings and funerals as well as for community events of fundraising and celebration. I am always available for an informal conversation with anyone considering being married in church or having a child baptised. Confirmations can also be arranged either in one of our churches or at the Easter Vigil at Norwich Cathedral. *Please contact me by phone or email if you would like to know more.*

Midweek Communions: usually take place on Wednesday mornings at 10.30am on a rotating basis in Ashby St Mary, Bergh Apton, Framingham Pigot and Thurton and on the first Thursday of each month at Yelverton. *Please see the separate table on Page 5 for details of locations and dates.*

The service is from the Book of Common Prayer and lasts for 30 minutes. I am usually available after the service to meet with anyone who would welcome the opportunity to speak with me in confidence in a church setting.

Norwich Foodbank: The Thurton Benefice has supported the Norwich Foodbank for several years and there are collection boxes at the back of each of our church buildings. The amount donated has continued to be very generous in a couple of our parishes but has rather tailed off in others. As we enter the winter months when pressure on many families increases with rising heating and fuel costs, now is a very good time to try to reinvigorate our support for this essential charity. If we all managed to donate just one or two items each month, it would make a huge difference. Thank you for your support.

Safeguarding: The churches of the Thurton Benefice are committed to the safeguarding, care and nurture of everyone within our Church community. PCC members and all volunteers who work with children or vulnerable adults have completed or are undertaking the appropriate safeguarding training and the PCCs are adopting formal safeguarding policies to ensure we comply with all current legislation. If you have a safeguarding concern please contact our Safeguarding Officer, Mrs Leo Smith, 01508 493695 or me on 01508 484174. Where a child or adult is at imminent risk do not delay: call 999.

Home visits and Home Communions: I am very keen to visit anyone who is unwell or feeling isolated or lonely, either simply for a conversation or to share Holy Communion in their home. *If someone cannot make it to church, the church comes to them!* Please do contact me if you, or anyone you know, would like a visit. I am particularly keen to hear if a parishioner has been admitted to hospital; I would rather be told several times than not at all!

Bishop of Norwich Annual Ecology Award

Research into nesting curlews has won student Caleb Stradling the Bishop of Norwich's annual Ecology prize. The £1,000 prize is awarded to the University of East Anglia student achieving the highest marks for a masters dissertation in applied ecology and conservation.



The Bishop of Norwich, the

Right Revd Graham Usher, said: "As a Christian it is my calling to care for God's creation, and it is a privilege to be able to support this kind of research. Caleb's work is giving curlews the best chance of survival and helping make it possible that generations to come will be able to delight in the beautiful curlew call."

Bishop Graham studied ecology at university himself and is the lead bishop for the environment for the Church of England.

Caleb, 34, said he was surprised and grateful to win the prize. "A love of birds and ornithology brought me to Norfolk and I had the pleasure of meeting and working with many brilliant ornithologists at UEA". He chose to study curlews after working with an organisation dedicated to saving the birds from extinction.



"I became enchanted by the curlew and its evocative bubbling song" he said. "Land-use change has led to habitat loss and degradation, putting additional pressure on the already-perilous saga of their breeding cycle, meaning that in many places curlews are not fledging enough chicks to sustain the population".

He is now working full time for Curlew Country in Shropshire and the skills he gained in his MSc, analysing how vegetation and agricultural practises influence curlew survival, are already having an effect. "Happily, we have had a successful year all round for the project with five chicks fledging in the wild, in addition to releasing 37 head-started curlews to reinforce the population. I also caught the bird ringing bug whilst working on the project so I've been training for that as often as I can manage". He plans to spend some of his prize money on equipment for bird ringing.

Professor Simon Butler, course director for the MSc in Applied Ecology and Conservation at the University of East Anglia said: "The award is a really valuable recognition of our students' hard work. It means a lot to students who often put themselves into quite challenging financial positions in order to progress in this kind of career".

The prize is sponsored by the Anne French Memorial Trust which supports the ministry of the Bishop of Norwich, clergy in the Diocese of Norwich, and projects across Norfolk.

South Yare Wildlife Group

The 'State Of Nature' report for the UK, which came out in 2023, made for gloomy reading, outlining the serious loss of natural habitats and the decline in biodiversity happening in our precious countryside. There has been a 19% decline in terrestrial and freshwater species across the UK, 54% decline in the distribution of flowering plant species, 13% drop in distribution of invertebrate species, 24% decline in the abundance of important seabird species, and on top of that, 16% of all our species are threatened with complete extinction. This is serious, not just for our natural environment, for the flora and fauna that is under threat, but also for ourselves, and our own well-being.

Another recent study, (from the Journal of Environmental Psychology 2024), reported that the UK is one of the least Nature-Connected countries in the world; 55th out of 61! The top 3 countries were Nepal, Iran and South Africa and the UK is teetering near the bottom, along with Israel, Japan and Spain. Access to the natural world is vital to people's sense of well-being, for good mental health, as well as spiritual awareness and a well-balanced lifestyle.

Fortunately, we live in an area blessed with a beautiful natural environment, and it is essential that we all cherish our valuable landscape and the wildlife that lives within it. We can all try to reverse this decline and there have been notable success stories; otters have returned to our rivers and broads, the red kite is breeding in our area again, and our own local conservationists have re-introduced the Large Marsh Grasshopper successfully into the Yare Valley. It is important that we all do what we can to help nature in our own "wild patch" and support all those who are striving to protect the environment for the future.





As usual all residents and other supporters were warmly invited by letter to come along to our annual Gift and Open Day to celebrate the work we had been able to complete with the funds raised by last year's Roof Appeal. On the day there was someone to show and explain the work that had been done, combined with a tour of the church and to explain its history.

The day was well-attended and was rounded off by a choral celebration in the Church by the Sine Nomine Choir who kindly performed for us "Songs for Spring and Summer", an absolute delight. The combined sum raised on the whole day was £3,438 for Church funds.

However, like all properties there are annual running costs which are paid from our general income, which leaves little available for any maintenance work. This year



our electricity and insurance amount to £2,065 and there is the Diocese Parish Share request of £8,513 for which our budget is only able to include a payment of £2,880 at this stage. Therefore, our annual Gift Day donations are an important source of funding for building repairs, and this year is no exception.

Since completion of the Roof Repairs project, we have had the Lychgate ridge thatch renewed, the remaining thatch tidied and covered with new wire netting, the organ retuned, permanent ventilation provided in the Vestry windows to reduce dampness and all the long grass and wildflower areas cut and cleared. We have also ordered Automatic Timekeeping Regulation for the clock which once completed will be reported in a future article.

So once again we give heartfelt thanks to all who donated towards the preservation and upkeep of the Church.

Sweet Thoughts From Local Children

"Roses are red, violets are blue, sugar is sweet and so are you."
Christmas is coming and with it lots of goodies: Christmas cake,
mince pies, Christmas puddings and chocolates to name but a few.
All of these and more need sugar. These are the sweet thoughts,
but what about the children?

In 1985, on a cold night near Christmas, local Norfolk farmer, Mike Buckingham from North Walsham, took his family to London for a treat. On returning to the train, they came across a group of rough sleepers. His daughter Annabel noticed these people and asked her father, "Why are these people sleeping on the streets?" Her father explained that some people don't have a home or money, so they had to find shelter and food where they could. His children were shocked by this. "Can't we do something to help?", they asked. That was the beginning of BEFA, Buckingham Emergency Food Appeal.

On returning home, the family gathered local farmers to help, some gave vegetables, some meat, and local shops and stores became involved. Annabel learned that sugar could be a good source of warmth and energy for the needy, so asked the Head teacher if he would ask the children to bring in a bag of sugar.



The Head teacher agreed and so the "Christmas School Sugar Collection" was born, supporting our local homeless and hungry families in crisis and those fleeing domestic



violence in East Anglia. A charity begun by children and supported by children.

Last year BEFA provided the ingredients for nearly 20,000 Christmas meals and 80,000 other winter meals in shelters. Our Christmas School Sugar Collection of nearly 4,000 bags of sugar contributed to this provision of meals and to supply night kitchens in many locations.

This year we celebrate the 40th Anniversary of collecting sugar from schools. Many schools in our eleven parishes and schools in Norfolk support this charity.

Our children and their parents show sweet thoughts of care and support for those less fortunate than ourselves at this special time of year, when it is important to be giving as well as receiving.

A huge thank you to our children, parents, carers and schools for their support and we wish you all a "Very Merry Christmas."






