Around the Parishes: Lowick

Lowick Parish Council

Our meeting on **Thursday 20th November** was very well attended. Paul Forshaw from United Utility's was invited to present the proposal to replace the water main from The Red Lion Junction at Lowick Bridge to the crossroads at Woodgate. He began by apologising for all the disruption and road closures caused by the need to repair the numerous bursts and leaks over the past three years or more. The monitoring system at the Red Lion indicated the need to replace the pipe immediately. Due to the high pressure (16 bar) required they would need to use a cast iron pipe which have proved to have an extremely long life expectancy.

The work is scheduled to start on **5th January 2026** with the proposed completion date of **27th March 2026** and will be subcontracted to two teams from Morsons Engineering Group and cost over £1,000,000. 1.8 kilometres of pipe will be replaced in three phases to help reduce disruption and keep Saint Luke's Church, Community Hall and parishioners properties accessible at all times. Road closures will be inevitable but access for emergency services and pedestrians will be maintained. The disruption to water supplies will be notified and kept to a minimum. A representative from United Utility's will be made available to liaise with parishioners whilst the work is ongoing.

After several years expressing parishioners concerns regarding the dangerous road junction at the Red Lion your councillors were invited to an on site meeting on 13th October with the W&F Traffic Management Team. We presented your proposed improvements and discussed how to implement them whilst watching the traffic behaving as your concerns had predicted. W&F contacted us before our last meeting agreeing with and suggesting improvements to your proposals. We have accepted their findings but asked them to extend the Double white lines to the Hunda T junction and change the wording on a proposed sign to read "hidden Junction" rather than vehicles turning. Your proposal document and W&F's response is available on our website.

Suzanne Pender wasn't present at the meeting but has reported that we will be electing a Mayor in 2027 and also suggested that we consider merging our Parish with another.

Archie Workman has retired from his position as Lowick Lengthsman we will miss his services and wish him a well deserved and happy retirement. The repairs required to the Bus Shelter at the Red Lion Junction has been put out to tender. We only had one quote returned so it was resolved to wait till the New Year before looking for other quotes.

After the resignation of John Townsend we advertised for his replacement. Your council have been most fortunate that Laura Scrogham has offered her services and we were very pleased to co-opt her onto your Council. Since then Carly Dacre has tendered her resignation so we are looking for another Councillor to replace her. If you are interested please contact Christine our Clerk on lowickpc@outlook.com.

Coniston Parish Plan - Your input please?

The first Coniston Parish plan was completed in 2004. Revised in 2011.

The purpose of the Parish Plan is to inform a village plan for the coming years based on the priorities and requests from the Parishioners to input to an Action Plan for the Parish Council and other organisations.

As we look to review the Coniston Parish Plan and as the Lake District National Park (LDNP) review the Local Plan the Parish Council are looking for your feedback on the priorities for Coniston Parish going forward. What matters to you, to your family and to the Coniston Community.

We're pleased to confirm that following the issues caused by Storm Arwen in a presentation to November's Parish Council SP Electricity North West presented major investment plans for a large programme of works to both the 11KV and 33KV supply that will increase the security of the electricity supply to Coniston. There will be inevitable road closures but a dedicated website and communications plans are being worked on by SP ENWL to minimise disruption.

Unfortunately, not everything is within our gift. But as a Parish Council we do use your feedback to try an influence the Highways Dept. (pot holes, drains and yellow lines etc.), Westmorland and Furness Council (street lamps etc.) and United Utilities (drains, water quality etc.) and the GP surgery remains a priority for the village.

Coniston Co-operative Society... a look back 150 years in history!

We're privileged to have one of the oldest independent Co-op here in Coniston, the origins of which go back 150 years.

The origins of which go back to the Sawrey Co-op (founded in 1875).

Wish the Co-op a Happy 150th Birthday?

Well, that could be a bit of a stretch. To be accurate Coniston Co-Operative was founded in **1898**. But that is still pretty impressive!

In **1844** a group of 10 weavers in Rochdale, Lancashire set up an early Co-operative Food Store. They had been suffering reduced wages and extortionate food prices, due to the effects of the mechanisation and the industrial revolution.



So, they pooled what little money they had to buy basic foods and sell it to their members, who had to take a share in the co-op for a small amount of money, in return they would receive a cash dividend on any profits made by the co-operative.

Their founding principles were to provide the community with good quality food at reasonable prices and share their profits with their customers.

They became known as the Rochdale Pioneers.

In **1875** a group of like-minded people in Sawrey, Cumbria saw the success and agreed with the principles of the pioneers. So, they decided to set up their own cooperative society, in Sawrey and initially it was successful.



Later in **1888** they opened a purpose-built store in Coniston, Cumbria which also became a great success.

So much so, that when the Sawrey store had to be closed, The Coniston became the Coniston Cooperative Society store (founded in 1898); as it is known today.

The Coniston Co-op continues to operate from the same location in the heart of Coniston against the backdrop of The Old Man of Coniston and continues to provide members, locals and visitors with a selection of fresh, chilled, frozen and convenience foods as well as a selection of wines and spirits.

The Coniston Co-op is one of the few remaining well-known and truly independent single-shop co-op societies alongside Langdale Co-op, Chapel Stile (Founded 1884 Allendale Co-operative Society, Hexham (Established 1874), Shepley Co-operative Society, Yorkshire (Founded in 1900) and the oldest independent co-op in the UK, Grosmont Co-operative Society, Yorkshire (founded in 1867).

The co-operative movement proudly continues to empower and grow the UK's co-operative economy, create a fairer society, and promote shared wealth through member ownership.

Patients Participation Group - 19th November report.

Haverthwaite Surgery Patients Participation Group convened to work through a number of listed items but also to thank retiring Chair Pat Procter for her service and support for over a decade. We also welcomed new members to the group.

The PPG were introduced to the new Practice Manager Laura Wright and extended their support to her and the Surgery in whatever manner would help this small but exceptional GP practice.

We are also pleased to welcome Dr. Abbas to the GP Practice who has very recently

joined the clinical team.

Whilst operating a PPG remains a CQC requirement the PPG is re-asking how we, the community, can best help. Generally, the PPG seeks to become a more visible conduit for patient information and specific questions or issues. Consequently, we discussed how the PPG can quickly move to a regular update on the Haverthwaite Surgery website and Facebook together with an email address for non-clinical Surgery matters.

All patients that use the NHS app for repeat prescriptions can now further benefit from an email to inform them that their prescription is ready to collect. Patients are reminded that using the NHS app saves this Surgery a considerable amount of time and we continue to encourage its use.

New Build - update - Some patients may already understand how challenging matching NHS criteria is for a smaller practice. One such challenge is in the plans surrounding a new build, whereby costs escalate to meet newer mandatory NHS policy specifically for new builds. Consequently, an alternative approach, based on some extensive modifications to the existing building, are now being considered discussions are ongoing.


