I recently heard of a survey of over 2000 UK adults, conducted for the Christian Charity Tearfund, where nearly 50% planned to attend a service over Christmas this year. I found that hugely encouraging! Over the years we have heard of and seen so much decline, and it's really good to hear a more positive response. At Christians we know the joy and delight that comes from knowing Jesus, and to hear of more people willing to explore that relationship with God for themselves, is really promising.

Christmas is almost upon us, and we have enjoyed many services and functions so far. In the busyness, I pray that you have also had time to prepare your own hearts, minds and souls, to welcome anew the Christ Child. To explore the wonder of his birth and all that means for us as God's people, and as his individual beloved children.

At our recent Sunday@6 where we explored the theme of 'Rejoice', I was speaking about the difference between 'happiness' and 'joy'. Happiness or being happy, is often momentary and dependent on circumstances, people and emotions. Joy on the other hand is something very different and I really found this definition helpful; Joy is an unshakeable spiritual reality found in God's presence. Or as the letter in 1 Peter 1 describes it,

⁸ Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy,

Despite our circumstances, our emotions, even the reality of our lives, we can all know that deep inner joy that comes from knowing and loving our awesome God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

As Christians we celebrate this good news always, and at particular times of the year even more so.





Also giving thanks for our renewed commitment to caring for God's beautiful creation and the achievement of our Silver Eco Church award this year.
















Christmas Craft Market - 6th December

Project "Wishlist"

Thank you to everyone who completed the form to rank potential projects we could undertake "when funding allows". The analysis of the data has now been undertaken and the number one priority (by both number of people supporting it, and the priority those people gave it) is to replace the current hymnal machine. This has been assessed as medium cost so may be achievable in the medium term, or we may find someone willing to sponsor a replacement.

Second on the list is internal redecoration of the church building.

Due to the Grade II* listing of the building this can only be undertaken by specialist heritage contractors so is likely to be a much higher cost that will need significant legacy or grant funding to implement.

Third on the list is to improve and extend the surface of the large car park.

Fourth was better lighting for the churchyard path. This was the only low-cost item high up the priority list and has already been completed. The floodlight in the tower can be switched on in the porch for events and Services. When locking up on a dark evening, with the switch in the off-position, a push-button delay will turn the light on for approximately ninety seconds, allowing time to reach the car park.

Other priority items were:

- · Improving the churchyard path (more solid/fewer puddles)
 - · Improving external signage for approaching traffic
 - · Solar panels on the Parish Centre and/or Church roof
 - · Replacing the Septic Tank with a small treatment works
- · Publicising church activities in the Eye magazine
 This list will help us to focus our attentions when applying to
 grant-making bodies.

However, we need to bear in mind that there are other, higher priority, items that need to be tackled first; such as replacing the rotting Parish Centre window and key items identified in the Quinquennial Report. Should other things fail (e.g. the boilers) these will also have to take priority.


