

# Introducing ordinand Nathaniel Jackson

THE parishes recently welcomed Nathaniel Jackson who is training for ordained ministry at Cranmer Hall Theological College in Durham and will be on placement until the spring. In this Q&A, Nathaniel tells us more about himself!

Tell us who you are and your faith journey towards training at Cranmer?

I'm Nathaniel, an ordinand at Cranmer Hall. I was born in Hartlepool, and I've always lived there. I have an identical twin brother, and we are very much alike! I grew up going to St Luke's Church and I remember

those days very fondly, being part of the Sunday School group and taking classes for children to be admitted to Holy Communion. In 2010 my grandmother had stroke, and over time she developed dementia. Due to this, we all stopped going to church and my faith seemed to vanish. For eight years I had completely abandoned God. In 2018, after a series of difficult events. I found myself desperately praying for God, if he was there, to help me. In that moment, every anxiety and fear disappeared and was replaced by an overwhelming love and peace. I had felt the call to ordination in 2019, and after five years of saying: "Absolutely not!" I finally decided to listen to God and explore my sense of call. This was affirmed by many people around me and by the Church, and now I am almost at the end of my first term at Cranmer Hall. How time flies!

How have the first few weeks been / any particular highlights?

The first term has been wonderful. I've really enjoyed all the different modules I've been doing, but my favourite has been learning New Testament Greek! I've also really enjoyed leading Morning Prayer and being involved in the different services we have.

# What are you looking forward to as you begin your placement at St Paul's and Whitworth?

I'm looking forward to getting to know the congregations a lot more and feeling part of the family. I'm excited to be leading some serves and preaching as well. I've settled in really well and I've felt so welcomed at both St Paul's and Whitworth churches, and I feel like this will be an amazing first placement!
