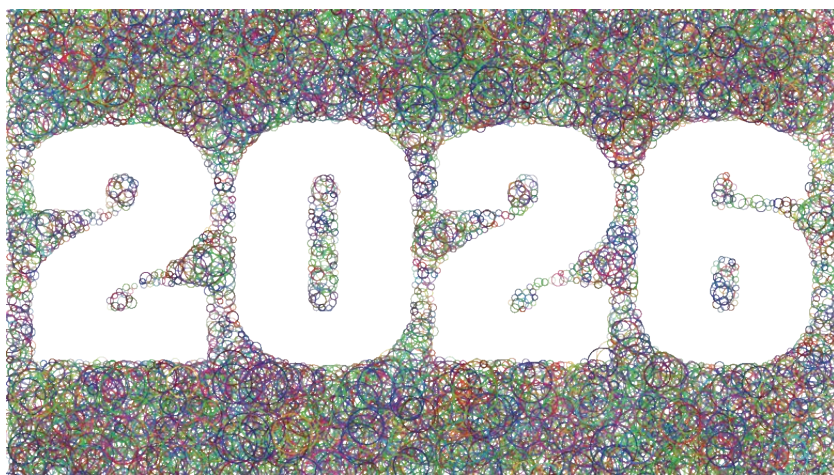

Happy New Year!



I wonder how you will celebrate the New Year's arrival. To many people it is just another day to work or survive. Children are not interested unless it happens to be their birthday.

However, we do need to mark the passing of time and a new year is important if you will be eligible to drive, or get married, start school, or collect a pension in 2026. The year is vital if you are researching your family history, or some past event. Of course, to organise life so that it runs smoothly we also need to mark smaller portions of time with clocks and then mark days, weeks and months. As if that wasn't enough we have seasons as well although they don't start or finish on any particular day.

The Christian church has its own calendar and seasons which mark the birth, life and death of Jesus. It started this new year on November 30th 2025! This was Advent Sunday which reminded us all of the coming of Jesus at Christmas. In January we mark the end of the Christmas season with Epiphany on the 6th January. This lasts until the beginning of Lent, in February.

Epiphany is the season marking the visit of the wise men to the baby Jesus. Usually the story becomes part of the Christmas story and we hear it and sing carols about it then, so that probably those variously called wise men, kings, or magi get overlooked. The Christmas cards always show three richly dressed kings riding camels holding their strange and exotic gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and following a star. We know that their return journey was not what they had planned because they were warned in a dream to avoid going back to the wicked King Herod.

If you are a puzzle or quiz fan you could spend a few minutes looking up 'Epiphany', 'manifestation', 'Gentiles', 'frankincense' and 'myrrh'. You may be surprised at what you find and the information will come in handy at the next Pub Quiz!

The kings brought gifts and at a new year it is a good time to think what gifts we have, apart from money, which we could offer to our families, friends, neighbours, community and beyond. We have been given the precious gift of a new year of life so it would be a good way of thanking God for it.

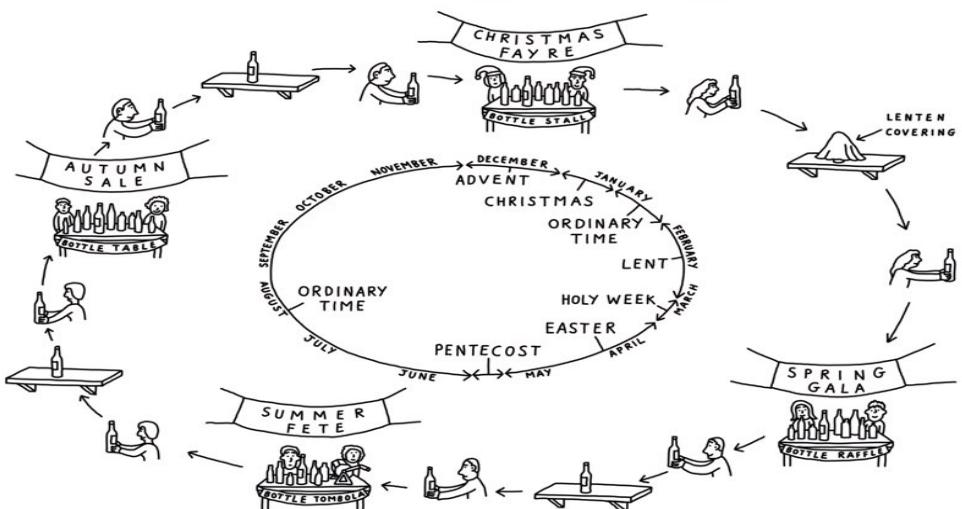

Festive Tea at the Tower

St Mary's Church in Acton invited the community to two festive editions of its popular weekly café, 'Tea at the Tower', as Christmas approached. The Sunday café, held year-round from 2:30pm to 4:30pm, offers hot drinks, homemade cakes and friendly conversation in the Grade I listed church. One session featured live music from The Swinging Woodpeckers, and both included mince pies served by dedicated volunteers. Donations support the upkeep of the historic building, which regularly welcomes 40–50 visitors, rising above 70 at busy times. Founded in 2017 with just a few teapots and plenty of enthusiasm, the café has grown into an award-winning community space. A representative from St Mary's said: "Our Christmas sessions are always a highlight — a chance for people to come together and enjoy the warmth of our wonderful community."

Christmas Tree Festival

St Mary's Church in Acton hosted its ninth annual Christmas Tree Festival from 5-7 December, transforming the historic building into a festive showcase of twenty-eight storybook-themed trees created by local groups. Visitors enjoyed a quiz, homemade cakes, handcrafted goods, and festive raffle prizes, while Nativity figures and atmospheric lighting added to the magic. Sunday featured music from Friends of Acton and the annual Christmas Walk, ending with refreshments and a visit from Father Christmas. Funds raised support the church's upkeep and community work. A St Mary's representative said the event was "a cherished tradition" and praised the community's creativity and support.





Holly Holy Day

St Mary's Church in Acton will mark the historic Battle of Nantwich on Saturday 24th January 2026 with a morning of events alongside the Holly Holy Day celebrations and the Sealed Knot re-enactment. Visitors can enjoy hot drinks and toast from 9:30am, before a 10am talk by local historian Mike Lea on "Nantwich's key role in the Civil War". A Q&A with Sealed Knot members follows, and at 11am guests can either climb the church tower or join a guided walk to the original battlefield.

The Battle of Nantwich, fought on 25th January 1644, saw Parliamentarian forces led by Sir Thomas Fairfax relieve the besieged town, securing a decisive victory near Acton. The tradition of wearing holly sprigs in celebration continues today.

St Mary's representative, Stephan Davies said "the church is proud to be part of the commemorations and welcomes visitors". Donations are appreciated.

School Children have their First Communion

Admitting Children to Communion

Over the last 18 months or so, the older children from Acton School have been joining with the Midweek Communion once each half term for a Community Communion. The children start attending in March of Year 5 and continue until March of Year 6, when they hand over to the Year 5 children in the year below.

The children help to lead the service, reading, leading prayers, presenting the bread and wine, helping to prepare the altar and asking questions which form part of a special Eucharistic (Communion) prayer written for use when lots of children are present.

Earlier this year it became clear that the next obvious step was for those children who were interested, and had been appropriately prepared, to be admitted to Communion ahead of Confirmation.

This took careful discussion in PCC meetings, and there was opportunity for anyone who wished to consider this to attend a meeting following the Annual Meeting in May.

It was a joy to prepare 4 children to be admitted to Communion, and to admit Matilda, Joseph, April and Emma at the Community Communion on 3 December 2025.

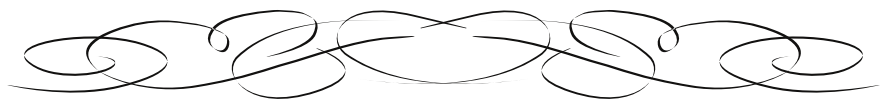

Favourite Hymns: Joy to the World

The hymn 'Joy to the World' is usually considered to be a Christmas carol, so perhaps it should have been in the December magazine, not January 2026! However, it was not written as a Christmas carol by its author Isaac Watts, the so – called 'Father of English Hymns'. Watts was born in Southampton in 1674 to a deeply religious, but nonconformist, family. His father was imprisoned twice for his nonconformist views, refusing to support the Church of England. As a child Watts displayed a remarkable ability to create rhyming speech and written verse. It is said that his father punished him for constantly speaking in verse at home. However, he was undeterred and went on to write 750 hymns, including 'When I survey The Wondrous Cross' and 'O God Our Help in Ages Past'. He had a lifelong interest in poetry, verse, rhyme and music. Watts never married and went on to become a pastor in the Mark Lane Independent Chapel in London. For two years he wrote a new hymn every week. Alongside his writing he was widely known as a preacher and private tutor to others who wished to become preachers. When he first published his hymns there was a mixed reception. At that time singing in church was largely confined to the psalms and some wished it to remain unchanged, others enjoyed the new songs.

So, into this environment Watts published 'Joy to the World'. In its original form it then went on to say, 'The Lord is Come', rather than the later version 'The Lord Has Come'. Based on psalm 98, the song was about the second coming of Jesus as a King, rather than his human birth as a baby. Like many of his songs, this one is a combination of deeply held belief, reflection and an emotional connection to the Bible and Jesus' teaching, alongside his knowledge of theology. It was a century later, in 1839, when an American

music composer, publisher, and banker, Lowell Mason [1792-1872], born in Massachusetts, discovered the poem and set it to a melody, 'Antioch', adapted from themes in Handel's 'Messiah'. By chance it was published just before Christmas and was immediately popular as a Christmas carol. It soon became the most published Christmas carol in the USA, cementing its use across the English-speaking church.

Isaac Watts died in Stoke Newington and is buried at Bunhill Fields Burial Ground in London. By the time of his death, he was known as a great hymn writer and had been knighted to reflect his impact on church music. His 350th birthday was celebrated on 29th September 2024 with a 'Songs of Praise' special edition, led by Aled Jones. Perhaps we should sing this hymn in January to celebrate Watts' immense contribution to church worship.

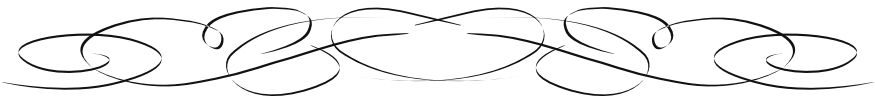

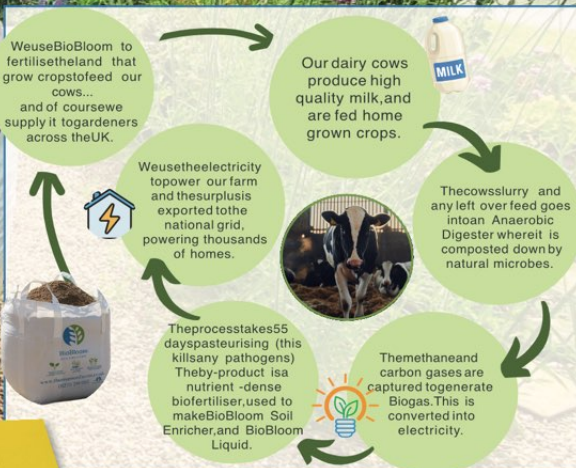

Recipe

Scottish Flummery

Serves 4

Ingredients

- 1 level tbs oatmeal
- 4 tbs liqueur
- half pint/275ml double cream
- juice of half a lemon
- 3 tabs clear honey

Method

- Heat the oatmeal very gently in a heavy based pan until it turns brown, then set aside.
- Beat the cream until smooth but not stiff.
- Melt the honey in a saucepan over a gentle heat until runny, but do not allow to boil.
- Fold the honey into the beaten cream and finally stir in the liqueur and lemon juice.
- Serve this warm cream and honey mixture in individual glasses and sprinkle the brown oatmeal on top.
